

A Meeting held on February 28th 1913

The minutes of meeting of September 9th 1912 were read and confirmed.

A letter was read from the Cambridge Town Clerk, in answer to a letter ordered to be sent by the Council re smells from Cambridge Sewage Farm but no action was taken on the letter.

Also a letter was read from the G E R Company regretting their inability to comply with the Council's request that cycle gates should be erected at the Milton Road level crossing.

A circular was read by the Chairman which he had received from the Cambs County Council, recommending that a meeting of the ^{Parish} Council should be called with a view to taking steps to support the Cambs County Council in opposing the proposed constitution of the Borough of Cambridge to a County Borough.

After some discussion of the probable effects of the proposals it was unanimously agreed on the proposition of the Chairman seconded by J E Honey that the following resolution be sent to the Cambs County Council:

That this Council expresses the opinion that the constitution of a County Borough for Cambridge would be prejudicial to the interests

of the community as a whole:-
 And That this Council urges the County Council to
 oppose the proposal to constitute a County Borough
 by every means in its power and pledges itself
 to support the County Council in this matter

The Clerk was also instructed to send the latter part
 of the resolution to the Members of Parliament
 for East and West Cambs, Sir C. D. Rose and
 the Hon E. S. Montagu respectively.

Proposed by A. L. Humphreys seconded by E. S. Robinson
 that the Council invite tenders for the office of
 assistant overseer annually, and notice be issued
 to that effect.

On the question being put there voted for the resolution
 A. L. Humphreys and E. S. Robinson against J. E. Honey
 and W. J. Wilson, the Chairman therefore declared
 the resolution not carried.
