

Meeting on January 7th 1919

Minutes of meeting held on Sept 27th 1918
 were read and signed.

A letter was read from Messrs Stubbings
 Tricklejohn and Smith asking the Council
 to procure some land and let it out in
 allotments, as they were unable to obtain
 any land on which to grow vegetables for
 their families. It was resolved that a reply
 be sent pointing out that no land is available
 at present but should there be any at any time
 the Council will do their best to obtain it
 and let it out as suggested by the applicants.

The resignation of Mr H. W. Williams was
 received in consequence of his removal from the
 neighbourhood. As the late member was a
 Representative Justice on the Parochial Charities
 he also resigned that office. On the proposition
 of B Pearson seconded by W Wilkin it was
 resolved that the appointment of his successor
 be left over till after the election of the new
 Council.

On the question of the erection of a war memorial to those residents who have lost their lives in the war it was resolved on the proposition of P. Pearson seconded by A. D. Jacobs that a public meeting be called by the Council for the purpose of ascertaining the feeling of the parishioners as to what form of memorial would be suitable and the Clerk was instructed to take the necessary steps to advertise the meeting and that the meeting should take place on the 17th January at 7 o'clock in the evening. It was also agreed that Rev. Canon G. W. Evans be asked to take the chair.
