It was resolved on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by G Wilson that the rent of the allotments be £1.15.0 per acre including rates.

A letter was read from Chesterton Rural Council asking the Parish Council to cooperate with them on the question of unemployment.

It was suggested that a letter be given all the unemployed genuinely desirous of work stating their names, whether married or single, and if married, the number of children etc.

It was resolved on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by A Butcher that the Clerk be empowered to give the letter asked for.

It was resolved on the proposition of C Day seconded by B Pearson that the Clerk write to the Surveyor of the Chesterton Rural Council calling his attention to the bad state of the path in Butt Lane and asking him to give the matter his early attention.

The meeting was here adjourned to Thursday Oct 27<sup>th</sup>.
