

A Parish Council meeting was held on
Nov. 11th 1921.

On receiving the report of the committee
appointed to ascertain the valuation to be paid
on the new land for allotments and also the
price per acre of mangolds on the land, it was
resolved on ^{the} proposition of S Casey seconded by
C Day that the mangolds be not taken.

It was agreed that the shifting of the gate
to make a more convenient position for entering
the allotment field be left in the hands of
the Clerk.

The approved applicants for allotments were now
received in the meeting. The Chairman explained
to the applicants that the rent of the land
would be 35/- per acre the Parish Council
paying rates. It was also stated that
any valuation to be paid would have to be
paid by the tenants.
