It was resolved on the proposition of G Wilson seconded by G Day that the Clerk be allowed a Petty cash acc the amount all to

exceed Five Pounds at any time.

The agreement for the Allotments was produced between the Parish Council and the Bucks County Council and was formally signed by the Chairman, Mr G Wilson, and Mr J Bayl on behalf of the Council.

It was resolved on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by A Butcher that a circular letter containing questions in relation to Rural Industries be left to the Clerk to furnish the information required by the Bucks County Council.

It was resolved on the proposition of A Butcher seconded by J Barton that ~~that~~ a piece of land containing 2 ac 3 rds 20 pbs be charged 2/6 per acre per annum more than the other part of the Allotments as it was considered to be better land.
