

A Council meeting held on June 16<sup>th</sup> 1922

Present B Pearson G Wilson A G Hall J Starling and  
S Eay

In the absence of the Chairman and vice Chairman  
Mrs B Pearson was elected to the chair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read  
approved and signed

It was resolved on the proposition of G Wilson seconded  
by S Eay that the resignation of the Town Clerk  
E Carleton be accepted with regret and that the  
Clerk be instructed to post a notice asking for  
applications for the vacant post.

A circular was read from the Secretary of the Cambus  
Education Committee stating that libraries were to  
be started in the villages and asking for the  
co-operation of the Parish Council in working the  
scheme. It was resolved on the proposition of  
J Starling seconded by A G Hall, that the Parish  
Council accept the offer of a library for the village  
of Milton and do their best make the scheme  
a success.

It was resolved on the proposition ~~that the~~ J of  
 J Starling seconded by J Bay that the Council  
 Room be used for the purposes of the library and the  
 Clerk be instructed to write to the Education Secretary  
 pointing out that the Parochial School is under private  
 control in the evening after school hours whereas the  
 Council room is entirely under control of the Parish  
 Council and is therefore a more suitable place  
 for the library.

Present

It was agreed that the sum of £3 promised by  
 Mr Pearson Mr Wilson & Mr Bay as prizes for the  
 best cultivated allotments hired from the Council  
 be allocated as follows:—

It was further agreed that Mr J Wilson of Milton  
 and Mr J Carter of Sandbeach be asked to  
 judge the allotments and that the judging take  
 place the first week in July.

It was resolved on the proposition of J Starling seconded  
 by A Halls that the Council take steps to obtain  
 a recreation ground and that J Bay and  
 Mr Pearson be authorized to see Mr W Fryer  
 of Milton Hall with a view to obtaining one of his  
 grass fields as a recreation ground.
