A letter was received from the Chesterton Rural District Council on unemployment.

It was resolved on the proposition of S Bay seconded by A Hall that the clerk post a notice asking for names of unemployed and to send names to C R D C every fortnight.

The Clerk produced a copy of the new County Rate Basis which disclosed an assessment of the Parish £161 above the Union assessment. It was resolved on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by S Bayly that the Clerk write to the County Rate Committee objecting to the proposed basis and pointing out that in the opinion of the Parish Council the Union assessment is high enough for the class of land of which Milton consists.

It was resolved on the proposition of S Bayly seconded by C Day that the Clerk write to the Cambridge Gas-light Company asking what would be the terms or conditions under which a supply of Gas could be extended to the Parish of Milton.
