

At a Parish Council meeting held on Dec 13<sup>th</sup> 1923 the following members were present Mr A D Jacobs Chairman, Messrs G Wilson, B Pearson, A G Stalls & Starling and C Day.

The question of the Council making a contribution towards the cost of a well at the District Council houses, adjourned from the previous meeting was considered and it was agreed that this Council contribute 25% of the cost of a well, in the following conditions:-

- 1 That the well be placed on the opposite side of the road to the houses as this would give more room and better convenience for drainage moreover should ~~should~~ the houses be sold at any time the well would be independent of the property.
- 2 That a pump be erected suitable for filling water carts.
- 3 That the contribution of the Parish be spread over a term of years so as to avoid the necessity of a special expenses Rate.
- 4 That the tenants be relieved of the extra payment towards the cost of a well which the District Council are asking them to pay.

The above resolution was proposed by B Pearson seconded by G Wilson and carried unanimously.

(on the proposition of C Day seconded by Wilson) It was resolved that the Clerk be instructed to write to the District Surveyor pointing out the bad state of the pond and asking him to give the master his early attention and also to repair the road close round the pump as this required some attention.
