The Clerk was instructed to carry out the work.

Applications were received for the 2 acres of land lately in the occupation messrs A Wilkin and R Stubbings from the following: to Constable S Sharp, B Shipp & C Butler, E Shipp & D Tyrell.

It was proposed by B Pearson seconded by A G Halls that B Shipp be let H Wilkins acre, and S Sharp and B Tyrell be let to an acre each of R Stubbings acre.
