

At a Parish Council meeting held on August 28th 1925 the following members were present: Mr A D Jacobs chairman Messrs B Pearson S J Starling J W Baxter, S Zoof and C Day also A G Halls

On the proposition of S Zoof seconded by S J Starling it was resolved that the Clerk be instructed to write to the Bursar of Gonville & Caius College asking whether the college authorities would consider the question of selling to the Council a field known as "Ground Piece" situate in Fen Road, for a recreation ground for the parish.

It was agreed on the proposition of B Pearson that the Clerk should ascertain whether the Parish Council have the power to spend money in placing seats in the village.

It was agreed that on the question of a Telephone service for the village, no action be taken.

It was resolved on the proposition of J W Baxter seconded by B Pearson that Mr S Zoof be appointed a manager (representing the Parish Council) of the Dilton Fen School for a term of 3 years.

A proposition was made by J W Baxter seconded by S J Starling that the rents of the allotments be reduced by 5/- per acre as from Michaelmas next.

An amendment was proposed by S Eay seconded by B Pearson that the question be deferred till all small holding land is revalued. The amendment was carried.

It was resolved on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by J Darter the Overseers be instructed to take proceedings against G Branch for the recovery of arrears of rates.

A Parish Council meeting was held on October 2nd 1925 the following members being present Chairman Mr A B Jacobs Mrs J W Darter S J Starling S Eay G Day and A G Hall.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and being approved were signed by the Chairman

It was agreed that the Clerk write to Mr C R Alder asking whether he would be willing to give up the field known as Pound Piece should the Council decide to proceed with the project of acquiring the field as a recreation ground for the parish.

It was agreed that the tenant of S Sharpe's land be required to pay £1 as compensation for crops left and unexhausted improvements.
