

At a Parish Council meeting held on July 1st 1927 the following members were present  
 Mr A B Jacobo (Chairman) Messrs J W Daxter  
 B Pearson S J Starling and A G Halls.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk approved by the Council and signed by the Chairman.

The Clerk reported the result of a letter he had been instructed to write to Mrs E Mills enquiring whether she was willing to sell her meadow known as "Cherry Close" to the Council for the purposes of a recreation ground, and, if so, what price she would be willing to accept for the same.

Mrs Mills made no written reply, but in an interview with the Clerk stated that she was willing to sell the field in question at a price of £100 per acre.

This <sup>deal</sup> was considered by the Council to be a great <sup>deal</sup> more than the value of the land and after some discussion it was agreed on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by A G Halls that the Clerk be instructed to write to the County Council asking for information as to the procedure to be followed in providing a recreation ground.

It was agreed on the proposition of B Pearson seconded by A G Halls that the Clerk be instructed to obtain an estimate as to the cost of a well and pump for the use of the allotment holders on the Council allotments.

It was resolved on the proposition of B. Pearson seconded by C. Day that a special Parish meeting be called to obtain the views of the electors as to the advisability of the Council proceeding with the provision of a recreation ground, having regard to the expenses that might be incurred in doing so.

It was resolved on the proposition of B. Pearson seconded by C. Day that the tender of S. Unwin for the digging of a well and the provision of a pump thereon at the allotments for the use of the tenants, be accepted. The tender was £10 for all the work and the necessary pumps etc in connection with the job.
