

A meeting of the Parish Council was held on October 22nd 1929 the following Councillors being present:- Mrs E Bay (Chairman) Messrs A G Halls, C Day, A I Butcher, A D Jacobs, & J W Baster.

The minutes of previous meeting were read and being approved were signed by the Chairman.

Correspondence was read from the advertising agents responsible for the Raleigh sign on the village green and on the proposition of A D Jacobs it was agreed that the Clerk acknowledge the letter and suggest that the matter should stand over till next June when the rent for the sign will be due.

Regarding the vacancy caused by the resignation of D Pearson it was agreed on the proposition of J W Baster seconded by A D Jacobs that the vacancy be filled.

On the proposition of A G Halls seconded by C Day that it was agreed that H Norman & G Johnson be each let a rood of land vacated by D Tyrell.

The Clerk reported that under the Renting Act of 1928 no rates were payable on the Allotments and after considerable discussion ~~and~~ J W Baster proposed that the rents to the tenants be reduced by 2/- per acre.

This proposal found no seconder but it was finally agreed on the proposition of A B Jacobs seconded by A G Halls that the rents be lowered 2/- per acre for the half-year ending Sept 29th 1929 and then given further consideration later.

It was agreed on the proposition of C Day seconded by A B Jacobs that ^{the} Clerk write to the Small Holdings Committee of the County Council asking that the rent paid by the Parish Council to them for the allotments ^{being} ~~was~~ too high whether they could see their way to bring the rents down to the level of the surrounding land.

On the proposition of J W Baster seconded by A B Jacobs it was agreed that Messrs Sack & Son's a/c of 7/6 for repairs to pump be paid.

On the proposition of J W Baster seconded by A G Halls it was agreed that the Clerk write to the County Council pointing out the dangerous corner at the point where Impington Road joins the Cambridge Road and asking that a danger sign should be erected on the Cambridge side of the corner. The Clerk was also instructed to suggest that some check should be applied to the speed at which motor-cars travel through the main street of Eddington as it was dangerous to pedestrian and motorist alike.
