the sum of £7-10-0

It was agreed on the proposition of Mr Butcher  
seconded by Mr Day that the four men  
nominated as Constables for the ensuing year  
should be the same as last year viz:-  
S T Froment, A Townsend, A Kidman,  
and H J Turrell.

Proposed by Mr Barber and seconded by Mr Butcher that a letter of protest be sent to the Cambs County Council respecting the proposals for a rearrangement of parishes in the County

It was agreed that the annual Parish meeting be held on March 19<sup>th</sup>

At a meeting of the Parish Council held on March 19<sup>th</sup> 1930 the following were present: -

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and with the assent of the Council were signed by Chairman

On the proposition of A I Butcher seconded by C Day that a precept be drawn on the CRDC requesting that the sum of £20 be paid to the Treasurer of the Council to meet expenses during the year.

On the proposition of J W Barber seconded by S C Nichols it was agreed that as the counter proposals of the Chesterton Rural Council as to the distribution of the Parishes into three districts appear to be reasonable and workable the Parish Council should support the Rural Council as far as possible
