

A meeting of the Jewish Council was held on March 25th 1931 the following members being present
 Mr S Bay (Chairman) Messrs S C Richards
 A G Halls A I Butcher C Day
 and A B Jacobs.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and being approved were signed by the Chairman.

It was agreed that a letter received by the Council from the Ministry of Health re Dr Woodman's roadway be sent to the Clerk of ^{the} County Council for his consideration.

The Chairman reported that he had been interviewed by a representative of the Surveyor of Highways of the County Council as to the views of the Jewish Council respecting some stones placed at the side of the path on the North east side of the blacksmiths shop.

In the opinion of the County Surveyor the stones are dangerous to pedestrians and should be removed.

On the proposition of A I Butcher seconded by A G Halls the Clerk was instructed to write to the County Surveyor stating that the Jewish Council had no objection to the removal of the stones with the exception of one at the corner

of the Church Lane which in the opinion of the Council is an ancient mounting block and as such is of some historical interest.

On the proposition of C Day seconded by A D Jacobs it was agreed that the Clerk be authorised to pay the fee of 4/6 to W^m Bloom for expenses pertaining to the uncontested election of Parish councillors

A circular received from the CRDC on Regional Planning was adjourned to the next meeting of the Council.

A cheque was drawn in favour of ~~rent of rent village green~~ Miss E M Robson for £5, being payment of rent of village green due March 25th 1931

A precept was signed calling on the Rating Committee of the CRDC to pay to the Treasurer of the Parish Council the sum of £20, this being the amount necessary to meet the estimated expenditure of the Council for the year ending March 31st 1932
