A letter was received from Mr G. S. FRENCH expressing regret at his unavoidable absence.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed, and signed.

Business arising out of correspondence :—

Upon the motion of Dr Woodman, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that a cheque for £10 be drawn in favour of the Clerk of the Chesterton Rural District Council in payment of the costs of the (BOTE) pit held on March 26th, application for that payment having been made since the last meeting.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the Chesterton Rural District Council to the effect that, in response to their enquiry, no arrangements existed for the cot

lection of refuse in the Parish of Milton, and that the whole question of such collection would be referred at an early date to the Parish Meeting.

UPON the motion of Mr Garner, seconded by Mr Eary, it was unanimously resolved that Dr R.M. Woodman be, and is hereby declared, elected Vice-Chairman of the Milton Parish Council.

UPON the motion of Dr Woodman, seconded by Mr Eary, Mr Butler was reappointed Caretaker of the Parish Room.

UPON the motion of Mr Eary, seconded by Mr Garner, Mr B. Shipps was reappointed Waterman.

The reports of the sub-committees appointed at the last meeting were then discussed.

UPON the Motion of Mr Eary, seconded by Mr Garner, it was resolved that the lease of the Parish Room from Mr G.H. Pearson be renewed for twelve months, with the proviso that the key of the same be for the future retained in the custody of the Clerk, Messrs Eary and Garner being for, and Dr Woodman against.

A statement of the accounts for the year ending 31.

March 1933 was then read by the Chairman, in order that the Council might arrive at some estimate of the future financial position of the Parish, which was then discussed.

Upon the motion of Mr Eary, seconded by Mr Wilkin, it was unanimously resolved that Mr H. F. Dyrrell be appointed Caretaker of the War Memorial at the salary of 10/- (ten shillings) per annum.

Dr R. C. Woodman laid upon the table correspondence from his legal advisers relating to the site of the old pond at the north-eastern boundary of his residence. Both this and letters from Mr A. H. Wild to the late Parish Council having been read and discussed, it was unanimously resolved, upon the motion of Mr Wilkin, seconded by Mr Garner, that:—

(a) Having duly considered the final opinion of the late Parish Council's legal advisers, as recorded in letters from A. H. Wild, Esq., Solicitor, and being thereby assured that the late Parish Council, after having adduced every relevant fact and circumstance, did wholly fail to prove or otherwise to justify the allegation that that plot of land is Parish property which adjoins the county-council road at the north-eastern boundary of Willow House, in this Parish of Milton, the present Parish Council holds the said allegation, as well as any claims based thereon, to be to all intents and purposes null and void, and it deprecates any explicit or implicit perpetuation thereof.

(b) In accordance with the foregoing resolution, and in consideration of the clear arguments put forward by Dr R. C. Woodman's legal advisers, as contained in documents laid by him before this meeting, the present Parish

Council supports the contention that the said Dr Woodman, as owner and occupier of Willow House, in this parish of Milton, enjoys a perfect title to unrestricted right of passage over the plot of land heretofore defined, and it wholeheartedly acquiesces in his freely exercising the same.

It was decided that the next Parish Council Meeting be held in the Parish Room on June 13th, 1934, at 7.30 p.m., and the Clerk was instructed to notify the absent members, Messrs Baxter and French, to that effect.
