

Council supports the contention that the said Dr Woodman, as owner and occupier of Willow House, in this parish of Milton, enjoys a perfect title to unrestricted right of passage over the plot of land heretofore defined, and it wholeheartedly acquiesces in his freely exercising the same.

It was decided that the next Parish Council Meeting be held in the Parish Room on June 13th, 1934, at 7.30 p.m., and the Clerk was instructed to notify the absent members, Messrs Baxter and French, to that effect.

The meeting, the duration of which was 2 hours, was then closed by declaration of the Chairman.

A Parish Council Meeting was held in the Parish Room on June 13th at 7.30 p.m.

Present :- Messrs D.H. Easy; F.M. Garner; J.W. Baxter; G.S. French; W. Wilkin; C.P.T. Whickworth; and Dr R.M. Woodman.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed, and signed.

Business arising out of correspondence :-

In view of the County Agricultural Officer's having again applied for payment of the amount due to him (£17.0), Messrs Rack's accounts (£4.17.6) being still unsettled, and the Clerk's quarterly salary's (£2.5.0) being overdue I see this minute-book [p.41], it was, upon the motion of Mr Easy, seconded by Mr French, unanimously resolved that the cheques already drawn in favour of the first two creditors be released [see p.45], and that a cheque for £2.5.0. be forthwith

divided in favour of the Clerk; also that, to meet these payments, a precept for £16 (sixteen pounds) be at once issued to the Rural District Council, which precept was duly made out and signed.

Upon the motion of Mr D. H. Easy, seconded by Dr R. M. Woodman, it was unanimously resolved that letters be sent to Messrs Simeon Easy and G. Urdin requesting payment of the allotment-rents due from them without further delay.

The Chairman and Councillors expressed their regret at having received from Dr R. M. Woodman a letter tendering his resignation as Vice-Chairman, to which office he had been elected at the previous meeting.

Upon the motion of Mr Gardner, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that Mr G. S. French be, and is hereby declared, elected Vice-Chairman of the Milton Parish Council in place of Dr Woodman, resigned.

It was decided that the question of remodeling the stones at the side of the path on the north-east of the blacksmith's shop and at the corner of Church Lane, concerning which the late Parish Council had been in correspondence with the Cambs. County Council [see this Minute-book, pp. 3 and 4], be referred to a future Parish Meeting.

Upon the motion of Dr Woodman, seconded by Mr Baxter, it was unanimously resolved that a Parish Meeting be held in the School on Wednesday, June 27th, at 8 p.m., for the purpose of informing the Parish of the general financial position, and to discuss other matters of general interest to ratepayers.

Upon the motion of Mr Baxter, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that Dr Woodman be appointed the principal speaker at the said meeting.

Upon the motion of Dr Woodman, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that the Clerk write both to the County Council and to the Rural District Council enquiring whether there is any possibility of this parish's being awarded compensation for the financial loss that it has incurred as a result of the borough extension's having reduced its rateable value.

(C) Upon the motion of Dr Woodman, seconded by Mr French, it was unanimously resolved that the Clerk write to the County Council informing them that in the opinion of this Parish Council that ~~that~~ ^{strip} of land which adjoins the County-Council road at the north-eastern boundary of Willow House is of the nature of a roadside waste, dedicated to the public, and that the County-Council authorities be therefore good enough to take such measures as may be necessary for its being kept in good order.

Upon the motion of Mr Baxter, seconded by Mr Wickin, it was unanimously resolved that the Clerk write to the Rural District Council calling its attention to the existing state of certain water-courses. It was agreed that the letter in question be written under the guidance of Mr Baxter.

Upon the motion of Dr Woodman, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that the village constable be asked, and the parish constable be instructed, to prevent people from sitting on the stonework of the War Memorial, it being understood that any action taken by the parish constable would come under the category of those duties for which he already is in receipt of regular payment.

Upon the motion of Mr Garner, seconded by Mr

Wilkin, it was unanimously resolved that a fresh inventory be taken of the furniture and fittings of the Parish Room.

The meeting, the duration of which was $1\frac{3}{4}$ hours, was then closed by declaration of the Chairman.

Business arising out of correspondence :-

In a letter dated 28 June 1934 the Clerk of the County Council, in acknowledging a letter from the Chairman dated 20 June 1934, explained what procedure must be adopted in order to claim compensation for the financial loss to the Parish due to Borough extension. After considering this letter the Council decided that the whole question should be entered into at a future meeting.

The Council expressed their approval of the Chairman's action in having cancelled the Parish Meeting that had been fixed for June 27th, the reason for the cancellation having been explained by the Chairman as the unavoidable absence of Dr Woodman on that date.

On the motion of Mr Garner, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that the next Parish Meeting should be fixed for a date when Dr Woodman's presence could be depended upon.
