A Parish Council Meeting was held in the Parish Room on July 14th at 7.30 p.m.

Present :- Messrs. Baxter, Easy, French, Garner, Wilkin and Winckworth.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed, and signed.

Business arising out of correspondence :-

In a letter dated 28 June 1934 the Clerk of the County Council, in acknowledging a letter from the Chairman dated 20 June 1934, explained what procedure must be adopted in order to claim compensation for the financial loss to the Parish due to Borough extension. After considering this letter the Council decided that the whole question should be entered into at a future meeting.

The Council expressed their approval of the Chairman's action in having cancelled the Parish Meeting that had been fixed for June 27th, the reason for the cancellation having been explained by the Chairman as the unavoidable absence of Dr Woodman on that date.

On the motion of Mr Garner, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that the next Parish Meeting should be fixed for a date when Dr Woodman's presence could be depended upon.

On the motion of Mr French, seconded by Mr Easy, it was unanimously resolved that at the proposed Parish

Meeting the Chairman should address the meeting on all topics other than those relating to the ~~present~~ question of the plot of ground at the north-east boundary of Willow House, the Council expressing the hope that Dr Woodman would himself speak on this subject.

The Chairman explained that the present meeting was an emergency one that he had, on the advice of the Clerk of the R.D.C., called at twenty-four hours' notice. The necessity for this exceptional procedure was <sup>occasioned by</sup> the number of complaints that had been made about the village pump, which made it appear that the supply of water was not as abundant as generally believed. In view of a possible shortage of water the Chairman, who had been in consultation with the R.D.C., invited the Council to consider the adoption of certain precautionary measures that might be put into operation at 24 hours' notice should the necessity for drastic economy become apparent from further complaints by those using the pump.

On the motion of Mr Eay, seconded by Mr Garner, it was unanimously resolved that drivers of water-carts not hitherto in regular use by residents of the parish, and of steam-propelled vehicles passing through the village, be strictly forbidden to obtain their supplies of water from the pump; and the public be warned that it might be necessary to impose more drastic restrictions upon the use of the pump — such as locking the handle, except at stated hours, and rationing the water drawn — at twenty-four hours' notice.

As complaints had also been made about the mechanical condition of the pump itself, the Chairman was authorized to consult with, and give an order to, Messrs G.W. Lack, for its prompt repair.

The Council approved of a cheque for £2 being drawn.
