

A Parish Council Meeting was held in the Parish Room on April 30th, 1935, at 8 p.m.

Present :- Messrs J.W. Baxter; D.H. Eary; G.S. French; F.M. Garner; Dr. Wilkin; C.P.T. Winckworth; and Dr R.M. Woodman.

Upon the motion of Mr Eary, seconded by Mr Garner, Mr Winckworth, the retiring Chairman, was re-elected into the Chair for the ensuing statutory twelve months.

The Minutes of the previous Parish Council Meeting were read, confirmed, and signed.

The Chairman apologized for the absence of the Clerk, who was prevented from attending the Meeting by reason of indisposition.

Business arising out of Correspondence :-

The Chairman was instructed to inform the District Council that their various communications in respect of the proposed Water Supply had been duly laid before the Meeting; to write to Mr C. Garner that his tender for the hire of the Recreation Ground could not be accepted, the Council being unanimously of the opinion that the said ground should not be let for a long period; to postpone all consideration of the Town & Country Planning Act of 1932 until the next Council Meeting.

Upon the motion of Mr Garner, seconded by Mr Eary, it was unanimously resolved that Mr French be reappointed Vice-Chairman for the ensuing statutory twelve months.

The Chairman then laid before the Meeting a letter from the Clerk, dated April 23rd 1935, in which he tendered his resignation from the

Office of Parish Clerk, the resignation to take effect on May 23rd, 1935.

Upon the motion of Mr Wilkin, seconded by Mr French, it was resolved that the Clerk's resignation be accepted. ~~Resolved that the Clerk's resignation be accepted.~~

The Chairman was instructed to inform the Cambridge Antiquarian Society that any measures they might see fit, at their own expense, and without inconvenience to the Parish, to take for the preservation, within the boundary of the Parish, of the boundary (?) stones already removed from their former sites by order of the County Surveyor, would be approved of by the Council.

The meeting, the duration of which was 1 1/2 hours, was then closed by declaration of the Chairman.
