A Parish Council Meeting was held in the Parish Room on Wednesday January 1st 1936 at 7.45 pm.

Present:- Mr J Garner P. Chairman.  
Messrs H. G. W. Wickett, Wickett.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read confirmed and signed.

A letter was read by the clerk from Mr J. Wickett who expressed regret at not being able to attend, also a letter was read from Mr Gurch (Chairman) apologising for his not attending.

Mr H. G. W. Wickett proposed that in the absence of the Chairman, Mr Wickett be elected Chairman for the meeting. This was seconded by Mr J. Garner and agreed by the remaining members.

A letter was read from the County Council re rights of way Oct 1932 and it was resolved to reply there to the effect that the said did not affect the Parish Council.

It was also unanimously agreed that the Income Tax demand of £1-6-11 be forwarded to the County Council, they being the owners of the land.

Letters were also read from Mr J. S. Gurch and J. W. H. Miller respectively resigning the posts of Chairman and Parish Clerk respectively, and it was unanimously agreed to accept same with regret.

Notice to quit the Parish Room on June 24th 1936 was also read from Mr H. Wickett and it was also agreed to accept

same.

Mr. Lett then proposed that a letter be sent to Mr. Woodman and Mr. G. W. Schwirtz asking them what the Council agreed for Mr. Woodman to accept the post of Chairman to the Council, ~~also asking Mr. G. W. Schwirtz to accept the post of Paul Clerk.~~ This was seconded by Mr. J. Garner and carried, all being in favour.

Notes of Quar of Paul accounts were also read, and it was agreed that the notice be posted on the Parish Council Board.

The meeting which last ended 9pm the house was then closed.
