

1936.

A Parish Council meeting was held in the Parish room on Feb 27th 1936 at 7.30 p.m.

Present: - S. R. M. Woodman, Chairman, Messrs D. N. Basy. F. M. Garner. W. Wilkie and The clerk Mr. H. F. Sutton.

The minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

Mr. John Walls was elected to the vacancy on the Council; later, on signing the Declaration of acceptance of office, he was admitted to the Business of the meeting.

The Clerk reported that the £70 received from the Borough under the Cambridge Extension Order, 1934, had been banked in a deposit account on Feb 12th, 1936 at Lloyds Bank no of Deposit Book 34601/11108:

A discussion then arose as to how to utilize the money. The Chairman reported that the interest thereon only could be used. A suggestion was made that, subject to the consent of the Ministry, it should be used ultimately to help to purchase a Recreation Ground, as there was already £100 plus accumulated interest placed aside for this purpose. The joint sums now gave some prospect of buying a Recreation Ground. Pound Piece was suggested. It was decided, however, to leave the matter over until the Annual Parish meeting.

A list of four men with the necessary qualifications to serve as

Parish Constables was then drawn up. viz:—

As a result of letters written the following monies due had been received for the allotments. Parish Land etc

The accounts were now paid up to date for the year ending March 1936. The only arrears were previous to this and were due from Mr. Geo Unwin.

Mrs H. Cox had paid the £1-0-0 due at Michaelmas 1934 for gravel Pit pasture.

Mr. S. Gary still owed for the year ending Michaelmas 1934, though he had promised the Chairmen a cheque, and had said that he would trust to the repair of the fence.

The Chairman and Mr Wilkin reported that they had inspected the fence and they made the following observation "That they thought Mr. D.H. Gary's advice should be obtained before proceeding with the matter"

Mr. D.H. Gary promised to inspect the fence.

Mr. Chas Garner had paid 16/6 due for hire of feed of Recreation Ground

Negotiations were in progress to obtain The Rent due from B.C and H. Electricity Co. for the hire of ground for Demonstration purposes.

The Chairman reported that the clerk had been unable as yet to get details of the allotments & Parish Lands. Owing to this, the vacant land had not been advertised.

The Chairman then reported that the Income Tax charged to the Parish Council was probably for Gravel Pit Pasture & possibly the Banks, not the allotments.

He was in negotiation with the Commissioners of Inland Revenue to have the Income Taxes correctly described.

It was proposed by the Chairman and seconded by Mr. Garner "that if the tax is for Gravel Pit Pasture & the Banks, it is to be paid"

Mr. Zary proposed, & Mr. Hall seconded, that authority be given for cheques to be drawn for:-

Proposed by the Chairman & seconded by Mr. Halls "That the Council inspect Gravel Pit Pasture in the the summer of 1936"

Prop. by The Chairman and 2nd by M. Wilkin "that the Annual Parish Meeting be called between March 14. & April 14" The date to be fixed by the Chairman.

Regarding the Footpath from Milton to Waterbeach: the resolution passed by the Parish Council had been sent to the Clerk of the C.C., the County Surveyor, Sandhitch Parish Council & Waterbeach Parish Council.

The two first had promised to bring the matter forward.

Waterbeach sympathised but could take no action as the footpath was entirely outside their Parish Boundary. Sandhitch Parish Council had promised to support Milton.

The Chairman proposed and was seconded "That the Clerk be instructed to write letters of Thanks to the Waterbeach & Sandhitch Parish Councils"

The meeting which lasted 1 hr, 40 mins was then declared closed by the Chairman.
