The Chairman reported that THE CLERK HAD RESIGNED as from xmas 1936, as he would probably be leaving the village. On the Chairman's proposition seconded by Mr Garner it was unamimously resolved "that the thanks of the Council be conveyed to Mr Sutton for his services as Clerk." The Chairman agreed to be Hon. Clerk: temporarily; & he was given authority to appoint a Clerk subject to the later confirmation of the Council if he could get a suitable person.

The action of the Chairman IN LETTING rood Flot No. 7 to Mr. J.Smith, & 2 acre of Plot No 3 to Mr E.Butler was confirmed on the motion of Mr Easy seconded by Mr Garner. (Mr L.Wilkin had left the village; Mr. L.G. Pearce found himself unable to till the whole acre)

On the motion of Mr Garner seconded by Mr Easy, permission was given for the Chairman to get out & to order new copies of Allotment Agreements at his discretion.

The Chairman was authorized on the proposition of Mr Easy seconded by Mr Garner to take the necessary steps to legalize the annual expenditure on the War Memorial.

It was proposed by Mr Easy & seconded by Mr Garner "that the cost of the Coronation festivities be met by private subscription, but that the Council call & pay for a public meeting as the initial step in the near future." This was carried. Thursday Jan. 28th was fixed for the meeting after a deal of preliminary discussion to prevent clashing with other engagements.

Mr Garner asked that the questions of unburnable rubbish & of street lighting be placed on the next agenda; this was agreed to.

The Meeting, which lasted an hour, was then closed by declaration of the Chairman.
