MINUTES OF ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD MONDAY, MARCH 15TH, 1937.

THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING & TRIENNIAL ELECTION OF PARISH COUNCILLORS were held in the Schoolroom on Mon., Mar. 15th, 1937.

AS the Chairman of the Parish Council was a nominee, Mr Walter Claude Mead was ELECTED AS CHAIRMAN. HE TOOK THE CHAIR AT 7.40 p.m..

THE following were declared by the Chairman to be validly nominated: Messrs J.W. Baxter, D.H. Easy, F.M. Garner, J. Halls, B.E. Lander, G.H. Pearson, E.J. Walkling, Wm Wilkin, F. Wilson, C.P. Winckworth, & Dr R.M. Woodman.

AT 8.10 p.m. a SHOW OF HANDS WAS TAKEN by the Chairman, & as there was no demand for a poll, he declared the following ~~as~~ to be Parish Councillors: Messrs D.H. Easy, F.M. Garner, B.E. Lander, E.J. Walkling, F. Wilson, C.P. Winckworth, & Dr R.M. Woodman.

THE MINUTES of the previous Parish Meeting were read, confirmed by the Meeting, & signed by the Chairman.

THE audited PARISH ACCOUNTS for the year ending Mar. 31st, 1936, were ADOPTED by the Meeting on the proposition of Mr F.M. Garner seconded by Mr Wilkin. The ACCOUNTS OF THE CHARITY TRUSTEES

were presented by the Clerk of that body, &, on the proposition of Dr Woodman seconded by Mr Garner, were adopted by the Meeting. A motion proposed by Mr G.H.Pearson & seconded by Mr Wilkin, "That the charity coal should be distributed only to pensioners who are not in work," was defeated, & the Meeting expressed the opinion that the distribution could safely be left in the hands of the Trustees. A vote of thanks proposed by Dr Woodman & seconded By Mr Garner thanking the Clerk of the Charity Trustees for his presence was carried unanimously.

Mr Simeon Easy asked Mr Walkling through the Chairman if the R.D.C. could do anything about the floods. Mr Walkling replied that the matter was receiving the R.D.C.'s urgent attention, & that he would stir that body up as much as possible to get safety in the future; he thought that the pipes in the drainage system were of too small diameter.

Mr R.C.Starling proposed & Mr Albert Coulson seconded, "That the Parish Council set about acquiring a recreation ground." The motion was carried nem. con.. Mr Simeon Easy then proposed a motion seconded by Mr L.Edwards, "That the present recreation ground be retained until such time as one be acquired by the Parish Council." This was carried nem. con..

Mr R.C.Starling proposed & Mr Jacob Coulson seconded, "That the Parish Council Notice Board be moved to the site of the old pond." Mr G.H.Pearson thereupon moved an amendment seconded by Dr Woodman, "That it remain where it is." The amendment was declared to be carried, &, when put as a substantive motion, was carried by 16 votes for to 4 against.

A suggestion brought forward by Mr G.H.Pearson that seats should be provided at the 'bus stop near the Institute, near the recreation ground or on it, & opposite the Council Houses, was promised sympathetic consideration by the Chairman of the Parish Council.

A vote of thanks to the presiding Chairman was carried unanimously.

The Meeting, which lasted until 9.20 p.m., was then closed by declaration of the Chairman.
