MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE PARISH ROOM ON WEDNESDAY, 13TH DECEMBER, 1939 AT 7.30 P.M.

1. MINUTES.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed by the Meeting and signed by the Chairman.

2. CORRESPONDENCE.
Information had been received from the County Council that no Tri-ennial election of Parish Councillors would be held before 31st December, 1940, and that the existing Councillors would continue in Office.

The Clerk was instructed to fill in and return to the Chesterton Rural District Council a questionnaire regarding the establishment of a local mortuary for the reception of bodies of persons who may be killed in consequence of war operations. The barn at Manor Farm was selected as the local mortuary.

The Chesterton Rural District Council had intimated that the Cambridge Borough Council had agreed to include Milton in their first call area in case of fire. This arrangement to apply during war time as well as peace time.

With regard to Fire Officers, the services of the two men already appointed would terminate on the 31st January, 1940, and arrangements would be made to train two or three auxiliary Firemen for local first aid duty.

A letter of resignation was received from Mr. B. E. Lander on account of his being called up for Police Service. The Clerk was instructed to express the Council's regret at his enforced resignation and also their appreciation of the very valuable work he had done during his term of Office.

An application for reduction of Bank Rent was received from Mr. S. Easy and on the proposition of Mr. F. M. Garner, seconded by Mr. E. J. Walkling the matter was adjourned to the next meeting.

The Clerk reported that he had given the Chesterton Rural District Council addresses in Milton where stackcloths would be available in the event of War Damage to Buildings.

A letter was received from the Honorary Secretary of the British Legion (Milton Branch) expressing their appreciation of the way in which the War Memorial had been tended during the year.
