

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE
PARISH ROOM ON 24TH AUGUST 1942 AT 7. 30 P.M.

There were present:- Dr R.M.Woodman, Chairman, in the Chair, Messrs F.M.Garner, E.J.Walkling, F.Wilson, together with the Clerk.

MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

RESIGNATION

A letter from the Rev. G.T.Berwick was received containing his resignation from the Council owing to his departure from Milton, and it was proposed by Mr F.M.Garner, seconded by Mr F.Wilson and carried unanimously, "That the resignation be accepted."

Mr E.J.Walkling proposed, Mr F.M.Garner seconded and it was carried unanimously, "That a letter be sent to the Rev. G.T.Berwick expressing appreciation and thanks for his interest and work on the Council, and in other spheres connected with the Council."

ELECTION OF NEW PARISH COUNCILLOR

On the proposition of Mr F.M.Garner, seconded by Mr E.J.Walkling and carried unanimously, Mr B.Lander was elected to serve on the Council.

FEED OF RECREATION GROUND

The Chairman reported that Mr W.Hall had asked whether he might have the feed of the Recreation Ground before 29th September, and Mr E.J.Walkling proposed, Mr F.M.Garner seconded and it was carried unanimously, "That Mr Hall be approached for 10/- ~~XXXXXXX~~ for hire of feed straightaway."

RE-HIRING OF RECREATION GROUND

After some discussion, it was decided to hold a special meeting on the 23rd September 1942, to decide on the re-hiring of the Recreation Ground, when fuller facts could be obtained on the position, should the field be used as a gypsy encampment.

MR S.EASY'S OFFER OF BANK RENT

The following resolution was proposed by Mr F.M.Garner, seconded by Mr F.Wilson and carried unanimously, "That the Council accept Mr S.Easy's offer of £2 for this year, ~~£1~~ in view of the damage done to the grass by roding, but that the correct rent must be paid in future."

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Chairman reported the removal of the bones for salvage and Mr E.J.Walkling moved, Mr F.M.Garner seconded and it was carried unanimously, "That the money for the salvaged bones be given to Charity at the discretion of the Chairman."

The Clerk reported that she had been unable to make arrangements for a tin dump and she was instructed to approach Mr A Winship whether he would provide a site.

It was decided to post up the notice from the County Council concerning the illegal use of allotments provided by Local Authorities for flower growing.

This concluded the business, and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
