MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed
by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

WAR MEMORIAL

Mr Lander was cordially thanked for his work in producing
such a splendid show of flowers on the War Memorial during
the summer months.

PARISH COUNCIL ACCOUNTS

The Accounts for the year ended 31st March 1943 were
examined and on the proposition of Mr E.J.Walkling seconded by
Mr B.E.Lander, these were unanimously adopted.

CHARITY TRUSTEES ACCOUNTS

The Clerk of the Trustees presented the audited accounts
of the Milton Parochial Charities for the year ended 31st
December 1943. Mr E.J.Walkling proposed, Mr A.I.Butcher
seconded and the meeting unanimously accepted the accounts.

ATTENTION TO SLACKER.

Mr J.W.Baxter brought the attention of the meeting to the
condition of the lower slacker in the Parish Ditch. After some
discussion the Clerk was instructed to make enquiries about
this of the Waterman.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Milton Parish
Council, held in the Parish Room on 25th Apr.,
1944.

There were present: Messrs. F. M. Garner, B. E. Lander,
J. Russell, E. J. Walkling, F. Wilson, & Dr. R. M.
Woodman.

Mr Walkling took the chair pro-tem, & Mr.
Garner proposed & Mr Lander seconded that Dr.
Woodman be re-elected to the chair for the
ensuing year. There being no further nominations,
Mr. Walkling put the proposition, & it was carried
unanimously. Dr. Woodman thereupon took the
chair, & thanked the Council for their confidence in
him.

The minutes of the last meeting of the Council were

read, confirmed by the Council, & signed by the Chairman. The Chairman explained that the Clerk was absent because of the serious illness of her mother; but she had acquainted him with the fact that the Rector had declined the chairmanship of the "Salute the Soldier Week" because of 'heavy commitments' at that time. It was agreed that Miss Joy Brown should be asked to collaborate with Miss Conder in taking control of the week.

On the proposition of Mr. Lawder seconded by Mr. Russell, Mr. E. J. Walkling was nominated as Vice-Chairman. Mr. Walkling thanked the Council for the honour.

It was agreed that Mr. Wilson should try to arrange for a couple of cartloads of clinkers to be transported to the Park Allotments to make up the entrance at the gates.

The Chairman was asked to acquaint the County Surveyor with the fact that the fence of the bridge over Banker's Ditch had disappeared.

It was agreed that Messrs. Garner of Cambridge should be asked to repair the woodwork of the village pump.

The Chairman reported that the Allotment rents had been collected by the Clerk. This concluded the business, & the Meeting was declared closed.
