

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD AT
WILLOW HOUSE ON 13TH FEBRUARY 1945.

THERE were present:-

Dr R.M.Woodman, Chairman, in the Chair, Messrs F.M.Garner, B.E.Lander, J.Russell, E.J.Walkling, F.Wilson, together with the Clerk.

MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES

There being no other enquiries after W.Constable's allotment, it was agreed that V.Shipp be allowed to take it over.

CORRESPONDENCE

A letter was read from Mr Dixon, Fen Road, in which he made complaints about the smell from a ditch near his house. After discussion Mr E.J.Walkling proposed, seconded by Mr F.M.Garner, that the Sanitary Inspector be acquainted with the unsanitary condition of the ditch, and also that of the ditch running from Butt Lane through the village and down Fen Road.

PRECEPT

On the proposition of Mr E.J.Walkling, seconded by Mr J.Russell, it was unanimously decided to precept for the sum of £30.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Clerk reported that Mr B.Pearson would make another attempt to sow the Banks with grass seed this spring.

Sewage

After a full discussion it was resolved on the proposition of Mr F.M.Garner, seconded by Mr J.Russell and carried unanimously that the following resolution be sent to the Chesterton Rural District Council:-

" That in view of the pollution of the ditches of Milton by sewage and other foul matters, and the close proximity to Milton of the Milton Road Sewage Works, this Council is strongly of the opinion that the time is opportune for Milton to be sewered."

Streetlighting

The following resolution was ~~XXXX~~ proposed by Mr B.E.Lander, seconded by Mr J.Russell and carried unanimously:-

" That this Council begs to make application of the Chesterton R.D.C. for streetlighting by electricity for Milton."

Village Hall

Then followed a general discussion on the necessity for a Village Hall in which all members took part, but no propositions were made.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
