MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE

7.30 P.M.

MINUTES.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed by
the Meeting and signed by the Chairman.

RESIGNATION OF WATERMAN. The Clerk read a letter from Mr. B. Shipp
resigning his position as Parish Council Waterman as from Michaelmas
1946. The Chairman proposed and Mr. L. A. Easy seconded that a
letter of thanks and appreciation be sent to Mr. Shipp for the
splendid way he had performed his duties over a period of 30 years.
This was carried unanimously.

Regarding a successor, the Clerk was
instructed to advertise on the Parish notice board for a Waterman at
a quarterly salary of £1.

1914 - 1918 War Memorial. A letter from the Secretary of the
British Legion (Milton Branch) complaining of the dilapidated state
of the Memorial was considered. The Clerk was instructed to approach
Mr. Lander to see whether he would be willing to again act as
caretaker of the Memorial.

SUPPLY OF DUSTBINS. A letter from the Chesterton Rural District
Council concerning the supply of dustbins was considered and it was
agreed that this be posted on the notice board and anyone who
required to take advantage of the offer should communicate with the
Clerk.

COLLECTION OF RUBBISH. The Clerk reported that he had been approached by a parishioner with a view to the C.R.D.C. extending their route for collection of rubbish as far as the river in order that the householders at Baitsbite Locks might avail themselves of the service provided. It was decided that this was a matter for the individual concerned applying personally to the Rural District Council.

Another application from the same parishioner for a road sign direction to Baitsbite Locks was also considered and here again the Clerk was instructed to reply that this was a matter for the County Council Roads and Bridges Committee.

BILLS FOR PAYMENT. On the proposition of Mr. J. Russell seconded by Mr. F. Wilson the following bills were authorised to be paid:

ANY OTHER BUSINESS. Mr. J. Russell raised the question of the pathway at Milton Laundry being extended as far as Messrs. Edmunds' gateway, in view of this latter place being a bus stop. On the proposition of Mr. A. W. Wenham seconded by Mr. F. Wilson the Clerk was instructed to communicate with the Roads and Bridges Committee asking that the existing pathway be extended for this short distance. At the same time he was to draw attention to the large puddle which formed over the pathway immediately outside the Chapel, and to enquire whether this also could have attention.

The seat erected on the path near the Men's Institute was reported by the Clerk to have been damaged and after discussing the matter he was instructed to get an estimate for repairing and refixing.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.

It was unanimously agreed that while he executed these duties he should receive the Waterman's salary of £4 per annum dating from 29th September, 1946. The Clerk reported that he would require a Crome in the course of these duties and was instructed to procure one.
