

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE BRITISH LEGION HALL ON TUESDAY, 4TH FEBRUARY, 1947 AT 8.30 P.M.

There were present:

MINUTES: The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

MONIES RECEIVED. The Clerk reported the receipt of the following:

PRECEPT FOR 1947-1948. The Clerk presented a rough estimate of expenditure for the coming year and on the proposition of Mr. E. J. Walkling seconded by Mr. F. Wilson it was agreed to precept on the Chesterton Rural District Council for the sum of £20.

IMPINGTON VILLAGE COLLEGE. On the proposition of Mr. D. Pearson seconded by Mr. A. W. Wenham, Mr. J. Russell was unanimously re-elected representative on the Governing Body.

CAMBRIDGE BOROUGH COUNCIL - APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF BOUNDARIES. A letter from Chesterton Rural District Council giving particulars of the application by Cambridge Borough Council for an extension of its boundaries, which would include the whole of the built-up area of Milton, was discussed.

Mr. E. J. Walkling proposed and Mr. D. Pearson seconded - "That this Council opposes the proposals of the Cambridge Borough Council for an extension of its boundaries".

This resolution was put to the vote, there voting in favour of the motion -

There being an equal vote the Chairman gave his casting vote against the motion.
