MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL  
HELD IN THE SCHOOLROOM ON FRIDAY, 9TH JUNE, 1950  
AT 8.0 P.M.

APOLOGIES for absence were received from Mr. C. W. Langley and Rev. J. M. Plumley.

MINUTES. The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed by the Meeting and signed by the Chairman.

GRAVEL WORKING PART O.S.P. 149. (Field at rear of Petrol Pumps.)

A letter was read from the County Planning Officer intimating that the County Planning Committee contemplated granting permission to the Landbeach Sand and Gravel Company to use for gravel extraction part of O.S.P. 149, Cambridge Road, Milton. Before granting permission they asked for the observations of the Council. Accordingly the matter was discussed by the Council and it was unanimously agreed to object in the strongest possible terms to any additional land in Milton being used for the purpose of extracting gravel. The Clerk was instructed to reply to this effect.

PUBLIC PUMPS. The Chesterton Rural District Council confirmed a recommendation of the Public Health Committee that where a piped supply of water was available the repair of public pumps should be discontinued. Accordingly as from 30th November, 1950, the repair of the pumps at the War Memorial and the Council Houses would cease. The Parish Council, however, decided to continue maintaining as heretofore the pump at the War Memorial.

SEWAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL. A letter from the Ministry of Health was received intimating that should any relaxation of existing restrictions on capital investment works make it possible to reconsider the scheme for Milton, the Council's representations would be borne in mind.
