MINUTES. The Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 23rd May, 1950, were confirmed and signed.

PARISH COUNCIL ACCOUNTS. The Clerk presented the Parish Council Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 1950, and these were unanimously adopted.

MILTON PAROCHIAL CHARITIES. The Clerk presented the accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1950, and after examination these were unanimously adopted.

MILTON VILLAGE HALL PLANNING AND BUILDING COMMITTEE. Mr. S. A. Siggs as Chairman of the Planning and Building Committee, gave a brief resume of the Committee's activities during the past year. These had resulted in a profit of £22, bringing the total accumulated fund to £592. The prospects for the acquisition of a village hall or a recreation ground did not appear to be very good and the Committee had agreed to considerably curtail activities and a sub-committee had been appointed to manage and arrange the restricted activities.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
