Minutes of a Meeting of Milton Parish Council held in the Schoolroom on Monday, 15th September 1952, at 7.30 p.m.

There were present:-

Mr. E. J. Walkling, Chairman, Mr. C. W. Langley, Mrs. C. W. Langley, Mr. D. Pearson, Mrs. D. Pearson, Mrs. S. A. Siggs and Mr. A. W. Wenham, together with the Clerk.

Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting held on 23rd May 1952 were read, confirmed and signed.

Matters arising from Minutes

Seats - The Clerk reported that Mr. Siggs and himself had repaired one seat at the Cemetery and that permission had now been received from the County Council for the removal of the other seat from the Cemetery to a site near the 'bus stop at Bene't Close. The Council expressed their gratitude for the work already done.

Over 60's Club. The Clerk reported that a Public Meeting had been held on the 26th June which was addressed by Miss D. M. Warrington. A Committee was formed and the first meeting of the Club, at which there was an attendance of 21, held on the 9th September.

Fen Road Ditch. A letter from the Chesterton Rural District Council stating they were satisfied that the work was carried out in a proper manner and that no further action was proposed, was received. The Clerk was instructed to communicate with the Electricity Board Fens Sub-Area, pointing out that the lake was holding up the water and asking if steps could be taken to alleviate this. In addition it was proposed to bring this matter to the notice of the County Land Agent, Cambridgeshire County Council.

Stamp Machine and Post Box

The Glerk reported that arising out of a request made at the Annual Parish Meeting for the provision of a stamp machine at the Post Office, the Postmaster considered the facilities for obtaining postage stamps were adequate and was unable to accede to the request. He had, however, authorised the erection of a post box in the vicinity of the Petrol Pumps as soon as the supply positionallowed.

Ditch in Butt Lane.

A discussion took place regarding a letter from Mr.

K. P. Humphres asking if the responsibility for cleaning out the ditch in front of his property rested with the Chesterton Rural District Council, who had until 1939 accepted such responsibility. The Clerk explained that Mr. Humphries was not so much concerned with the cleaning of the ditch, but the fact that if at some future date it was decided to fill in the ditch, would the frontagers be called upon to bear this expense. In this connection the Clerk reported that an assurance had already been received from the County. Surveyor that a length of approximately 100 yards of this ditch would be filled in either during the present financial year or during the year 1953/54, at the County Council's expense.

County Development Plan

The Clerk reported that a Public Local Inquiry was to be held at the Shir e Hall, Cambridge, on 14th October 1952, into objections and representations received by the Minister of Housing and Local Government in respect of the Development Plan for the County of Cambridge. Enquiries had been made and it was ascertained that the Inquiry only affected the proposed plan for the City of Cambridge; at a later date a plan for the proposed development of Milton would be prepared and submitted to the Minister when an opportunity would be given for the lodging of objections. The Cerk was instructed to procure a copy of such plan when available.

Coronation Celebrations 1953

It was agreed that a Public Meeting be called for Monday 27th October in order to discuss the form the celebrations should take on the occasion of the Coronation of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on 2nd June 1953. Arrangements for circularising the various village associations being left to the Clerk.

The Clerk reported the receipt of the following monies:-

On the proposition of Mr. S. A. Siggs seconded by Mr. D. Pearson the above bills were authorised to be paid with the exception of that amounting to £16. 3.11. in respect of Election expenses. As regards this account the Clerk was instructed to enquire of the Returning Officer as to how the charges were made up, and under what authority they were levied.

Any other Business

The Clerk reported that he had received complaints regarding the two chestnut trees outside Milton House. These had grown to such an extent as to seriously impair the efficiency of the street lighting. He was instructed to report this matter to the Chesterton Rural District Council.

Mrs. Langley raised the question of the inadequacy of the 'bus service and stated that a special bus for Milton

patrons only was necessary on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons. Invariably Milton people were unable to travel to Cambridge at these times as the 'buses were already full. The Clerk was instructed to take up this matter with the Eastern Counties Omnibus Company.

The Clerk reported that the Cambridgeshire Parish Councils' Association Autumn Conference was to be held in St. Andrew's Hall. St. Andrew's Street. Cambridge. on Saturday. 25th October. 1952. at 2.30 p.m.. and this was open to all members.

The Clerk reported that a sluice from the River to Banker's Ditch was in need of repair. He was instructed to have the necessary repairs put in hand.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
