Bank Rents -

It having been explained by the Chairman that Mr Redfern had verbally agreed to pay what was fair for the Bank occupied by him - It was resolved that the Rent be fixed at 10/- per Ann: until Murch's rent making £1 ~~was~~ due for two years at that time.

The Chairman explained that he had settled with Mr Sanders until Murch's rent for £4/- and also that he had agreed with Nelson @ 30/- being 10/- per Ann: to Murch's rent.

A letter was read from the manager of the Sewage Farm asking permission to remove some of the dried Sewage - and it was resolved that a reply be sent stating that an injunction was granted in reference to this & other matters - declining to give permission & referring him to the District Council.

On the proposition of Mr Elston seconded by Mr Hobart it was resolved that the District Council be written to complaining of the fearful stench on the 29, 30 & 31 May & also of the water polluting our drains which appeared to run straight from the farm without filtration and asking that the Council be prepared for the Chairman's attendance at the next meeting in reference to the same:
