Report of the Meeting of the Cemetery Committee on Wednesday 11 April 1984.

Present: Rev. F. Kilner, G. Patten, Mrs. G. Tonks and S.J. Daniels.

Apologies were received from Mrs. J. Westwood.

The meeting was called to discuss rules and regulations for the Milton Cemetery and any other administration details.

It was agreed that the Rector take the chair.

The following matters were agreed:-

- The cemetery to be for all denominations. The Rector would have delegated powers from the Parish Council to oversee all burials. Undertakers therefore would need to contact the Rector first.
- Monuments and Fees. Regulations for monuments and fees to follow those of the Church Commissioners viz.

These fees would be reviewed at the same time as those of the Church Commissioners.

- * 3. <u>Reserving Spaces</u>. A person would not be allowed to reserve a plot except when reserving a plot next to a spouse.
 - 4. <u>Records</u>. The Rector would keep a register of all burials. The clerk would also produce a grid map of all grave spaces.
 - 5. Shelter. A lych gate type structure in modern materials would be preferable, situated at the entrance. Cost would determine the type of building.
 - Path. The grass to be cut short to create a path the width of the gateway.
 - * Amendment to item 3 (see min. 6161)

 A person would not normally be allowed to reserve a plot except next to a spouse.
