1856

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

On the Clerk calling for nominations, Mr.Pearson was proposed by Mr.Forbes and seconded by Mr.Kiddle; there being no other nominations Mr.Pearson was declared elected and took the Chair.

1857

ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIRMAN

Mr.Forbes was proposed by Mrs.Jones, seconded by Mr. Summerfield; there being no other nominations Mr.Forbes was declared elected by the Chairman.

1858

REPRESENTATIVE TO THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

On the proposal of Mr.Forbes, seconded by Mr.Easy and agreed, Mrs.Jones was nominated to serve for the remainder of the triennial Council Election period, ending in 1973.

1859

REPRESENTATIVE TO MILTON PAROCHIAL CHARITIES

On the proposal of Mr.Forbes, seconded by Mrs.Watson and agreed, Mr.Kiddle was nominated to serve for the remainder of the triennial period ending in 1973.

1860

CIRCULATED MINUTES OF MEETING OF MAY 4th., 1971.

These were confirmed by the Meeting & signed by the Chman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES (including the last ANNUAL PARISH MEETING)

1861

Recreation Ground Fence (gravel pit boundary) (1844B) - The contents of a letter from the Deputy Engineer (R.D.C.) had been telephoned to the Clerk that afternoon pending a confirmatory copy. The Engineer was concerned about continuing damage to this fence which had been repaired twice latest inspection, he claimed, showed ten points of damage. He required the Parish Council's observations to put before the Public Health Committee on Jan. 10th., when they would consider if repair was to be continued.

The Council then inspected the fence and on return the Clerk was instructed to reply that this Council had little control over vandalism; and that the use of the privately owned pit by fisherman and bathers was an invitation to break down the fence; they could not, at this stage, comment on future use of adjoining land; he was also to note that they thought damage would have been less had the fence been erected more securely.

1862

FROM ANNUAL PARISH MEETING.

Winship Estate - Screen of Trees (1844C) - The Clerk reported that he had written to Messrs Gray, Swann & Cook as instructed asking them to plant the listed trees without further delay.

He had also heard from the Clerk to the County Council who gave details of planting agreements with the agents for the Winship Estate and who said "the necessary screening and grassing will take place in the very near future.."

The Council accepted this if the Winship Estate carried out the instructions given them.

1863

Footpath and Gully near 23/25 Butt Lane (1828) - The Clerk to the County Council had also said that the County Surveyor was to carry out levelling of the footpath with a new gully as necessary to alleviate the flooding there.

1864

Cambridge Road entrance to Recreation Ground - The Clerk reported correspondence with the R.D.C. who confirmed a 'right of access' agreement with a neighbouring resident. The Clerk had approached the latter at the request of the R.D.C. He was agreeable to a padlocked gate and a trap-gate at the entrance adjoining the highway.

The Clerk was instructed to seek the views of the R.D.C. on the sharing of costs for these two gates.

1865

Wayside seats + War Memorial seat (1757) - The Clerk was asked to instruct Mr. Baird to place this seat near the Queen Anne Lodge, facing the Memorial.

1866

Northern By-Pass (1847) - A Report by the Clerk had been circulated; he had confirmed that the Controller and Group Engineer of the Eastern Road Construction Unit would visit Milton if the Council wished to explain the proposals and give details of the changeover at the A.10 junction.

Mr. Forbes proposed, Mr. Kiddle seconded, that a public meeting arranged by this Council to which E.R.C.U. representatives be invited, be held on Thursday, July 15th. The Council discussed the proposals and modifications to the centre line of the road suggested by Mr. Kiddle.

1867

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT ACCOUNTS, 1970/71

The Clerk submitted copies of the Committee's accounts received from their Treasurer. Proposed by Mr. Summerfield, seconded by Mr. Forbes, that these be received and the Treasurer thanked.

1868

A SPECIAL MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE MILTON FARM SCHOOL, WEDNESDAY, JUNE, 23rd, 1971

Two members of the County Planning Dept., Mr. T.G. Hardy and Mr. E.J. Wilson, accepted invitation to meet the Council for an unminuted discussion on Milton industrial planning, with particular reference to Messrs Stoke's developments. The Council considered this a useful and informative discussion and the Chairman thanked the Officers for attending.

Following the discussion the following Council business was taken:

1873

War Memorial Seat (1865) - The Clerk read a letter from Mr. D. Thomas, Queen Anne Lodge, pointing out that, suffering as they already did from much rudeness from youths who frequented the War Memorial green, he asked if the seat it was proposed to place somewhat near their boundary could be sited on the other side of the green nearer Coles road.

The Council agreed this request seemed justified and that a seat may become an undesirable gathering place for disorderly youths. Agreed to erect the seat on the grass verge on the east side of Coles road, between the lay-by near the Butcher's shop and the Fen road corner.
