

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL ON  
TUESDAY, JUNE 4, 1974 at 7.30 p.m.

Present: Mr. D. Pearson, in the Chair; Mrs. J. G. Chinnick, Mrs. M. E. Jones and Mrs. B. C. Waterson; Messrs L. M. Forbes, P. Kiddle, M. J. Nurse, R. T. Summerfield and the Clerk.

Apology: Mr. H. W. H. Easy.

- 2401 Election of Chairman: Mr. D. Pearson elected unanimously on the proposition of Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mrs. Chinnick.
- 2402 Election of Vice-Chairman: Mr. L. M. Forbes elected unanimously on the proposition of Mr. Summerfield, seconded by Mr. Nurse.
- 2403 Representative to Village Hall Committee of Management: Mr. P. Kiddle nominated on the proposition of Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mr. Nurse.
- 2404 Declarations of Office: The Chairman and other members present signed their appropriate Declarations of Office.
- 2405 Corrections to Minutes of Meeting of May 21 (see 2392): The Clerk apologised for an error which he had agreed he had made in MIN:2392 Item iii (Comm. of Mgt.) on it being pointed out to him by a member. The Council agreed unanimously that part of the item iii, line 9, should be corrected to read as follows:

"The Auditor had approved the Committee of Management accounts having received their Treasurer's assurance that the matter would be brought to the Committee's attention with the recommendation that it be referred to the Secretary of State for Education and Science"

MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES

2406 - CHANGING ROOMS PROJECT (2385) The Clerk reported he had written to Mr. Kiddle (Chairman of the Working Party) commending, as he was requested, the use of sub-contract labour which members favoured. The grant position was deteriorating and it now seemed likely the CC & DES contribution would be smaller than first hoped.

~~2407~~ ERSWARMERAKD ~~FROM~~ CLERK reported on consultation with the Enforcement (2397) Officer who had told him that the Mini Haul business was in the same Planning grouping as coal haulage and was, therefore, covered by established use. He also felt there would be less justifiable objection (if relevant) than to a coal yard.

2408 - STOKES EN-FORCEMENT OSP 220 (2398) The Clerk was instructed to contact the Planning Office telling them of the Council's lack of confidence in local authority enforcement due to the apparently endless delays before action taken, and also to ask the likely date of the legal hearing and this Council being represented there.

MATTERS DEFERRED FROM LAST MEETING

2409 - ANNUAL GRANT TO COMM. OF MGT. (2392 i) On the proposition of Mr. Nurse, seconded by Mrs. Waterson, it was agreed to grant the Committee the sum of £500, as last year.

2410 - JOINT MEETING OF P.C. & COMM. OF MGT. (2392 ii) Agreed to invite the Committee to a meeting at the Farm School if available; Mr. Kiddle to arrange a date with the Committee.

2411 - NORTHERN BY-PASS (2282) The Clerk reported receipt, on 23 May, of the Sec. of State's decision pursuant to the Public Inquiry of Feb.-July, 1972 and preliminary decision of September, 1973. The decision confirmed the published draft line of the Northern Bypass (with modifications near Quy).

MILTON: Among 'outstanding matters' the Minister stated that he accepted the

Inspector's recommendation (para. 758a) that, if possible, the Milton By-pass should be built at the same time as the Northern and draft proposals for this would be published with the draft side-road proposals for the Northern. No date was stated. He agreed an early Milton By-pass would be beneficial to Milton as well as saving in cost.

The Council agreed that this statement confirmed the Council's opinion and upheld their submission at the Inquiry.

2412 - C/73/1628/0 JAWilson & MrsMTurner - Farmhouse & bldgs. OSP145, Bene't Farm, Milton - Granted: conds. include access at northern end of site only; no bldgs. within 30ft. of 13th. public drain (s.&sw.)

2413 - S/0063/74 (2395) Science Pk. - mobile home for caretaker - granted temporarily, expiring 30/6/79; restricted to use of caretaker.

2415 - S/0296/74 Science Pk. Offices for Camb. Consultants Ltd. - no obj.

2416 - S/0290/74 J.Keefe, 46, Butt Lane - Brick Garage - no objection provided neighbours have none.

2417 - S/0295/74 G.Lemin. Change of use of factory premises (Messrs Kayes 87, Cambridge rd.) to light industrial inc. paint spraying etc. - Suggested use potentially dangerous as believe bldgs largely wood ?

2418 - S/0276/74 PA Technology, Winship Est. Temporary 'Portakabin' office in forecourt of KWKirk opposite; 'overflow' accomodation - Sewage embargo will be contravened by employment of extra staff ?

2419 - C/73/1682/F Cambs. Sports Adv. Council - Artificial Rowing Course in Milton Fen. The Clerk reported he had now co-ordinated and submitted the Council's objection on a number of grounds as follow:

1. Generation of traffic beyond capacity of Fen rd.
2. Cutting of, and devious diversion of, Fen rd. access to river
3. Visual intrusion into pleasant natural rural area
4. Loss of allotment land (further to that likely to be lost to the by-passes)
5. Loss of valuable agricultural land
6. Excessive traffic in general in village (adding that likely to be generated by already approved 60-acre Country Park)
7. Addition of another recreational area to the Park in the same parish is unbalanced
8. The suggested plan of development involving the financial necessity of leaving derelict 30-acre hole for at least 5 years is considered unreasonable.

2420 - CLERK'S PAY ( ) A lengthy discussion arose on the Clerk's reminding the Council of the present and growing work-load this parish now produced. The Council agreed to place a review of his salary as first item on the Agenda of the next meeting.

2421 - BILLS FOR PAYMENT On the proposition of Mrs.Chinnick, seconded by Mr.Forbes, the following were approved for payment:
