COUNCIL BUSINESS

- 5547 Acceptance of Office. Each councillor signed the 1. acceptance of office in the minute book.
- Election of Chairman. G.P. proposed, H.W.H.E. 5548 seconded and all agreed that B.C.W. be elected as chairman for the year 1983/84.
- Signature of Declaration of Acceptance of Office of Chairman. B.C.W. signed the declaration and welcomed everybody to the meeting, especially the new member Mrs. J. Westwood.
- Election of Vice Chairman. This was left in abeyance 5550 until the next meeting.
- Election of Planning Sub Committee. The following were 5551 elected:-

- (b) I.V.C. Governor. J.W. was elected having been 5553 proposed by R.D. and seconded K.P.H.
- Milton Charities Trustees. H.W.H.E., G.P., and A.D.J.B. 7. agreed to stand again. B.C.W. was proposed by H.W.H.E., seconded G.P. and was elected. K.P.H. having declared an interest did not vote.
- 5555 Representative for Milton V.H. & R.G. Committee. This was left in abeyance until the next meeting.
- 5556 Milton Plan - Recreation Land. Mr. Sillery attended the (5546) meeting at this point and was able to reassure the Council that the village would get a 9 acre recreation ground in one piece. It was he said essential that the M.P.C. identify the exact piece of land required so that he would be able to have this land conveyed to the M.P.C. as soon as possible. He pointed out that the purchase price of the Bene't Farm Site had been adjusted to take into account a 9 acre recreation ground. Mr. S. would try to obtain help from the developers in

the lay-out of the recreation ground.

The housing on the Bene't Farm Site being medium density

would be 11 to the acre.

Drainage would have to be adequate to cope with the proposed buildings and the overall principles of the drainage scheme were still the same.

The chairman thanked Mr. Sillery for attending, at which

point he left the meeting.

It was agreed that an on site meeting would take place on Thursday 19 May at 6pm in order to identify the exact piece of land for recreation purposes. (5505) The Clerk read a letter from Mr. Wilson which suggested

- that the Headmaster and Governors of Milton School be approached concerning the dual use of school and public playing fields. It was agreed that the Clerk should write to the Headmaster and Governors. K.P.H. informed the meeting that 50 copies of the Milton Plan would be in the Mobile Library and 30 copies in the Central Library. J.W. raised the possibility of having the Plan on display at the school during the day time. K.P.H. would raise this matter again with the Planning Officer.
- The minutes of the meeting held on 11 April 1983 had been circulated and were confirmed and signed.

11. Matters Arising.

- Cemetery. Anglian Water had no objection to this application (5475) provided that there were to be no buriels within 5 metres of the adjacent water course.
- Village Sign. Mr. Lapham would be delighted to fix together 5559 (5502) the sign although he would have to make a charge. He would provide a quotation when it was ready to be assembled.
- Allotments. Although the pump had been repaired G.P. 5560 (5506) reported that the head was loose. It was agreed that the Clerk withhold payment to George Lack until the pump had been checked and a detailed breakdown of the invoice was received. The Clerk would produce an up to date map for allotment holders. Following G.P.'s suggestion the Council agreed to meet at the entrance to the allotments on Friday 20 May at 4.30pm
- Gypsy Site. A letter had been received from Mrs. Letley 5561 (5507) explaining that the proposed warden although part time would be on call 24 hours per day in case of problems arising. She would ask the City Council to bear in mind

for an inspection of the site.

Pear Tree - Willow Crescent. The request had been passed (5511) on to Mr. Kisby's department. It was hoped that he would be able to undertake this work.

- 5563 Seats. It was agreed that Mr. Symonds be asked to varnish (5512) the seats.
- 5564 <u>Grass Cutting</u>. The Clerk was still awaiting confirmation (5513) from Cornhill that Mr. S. Shipp would be insured against accidents whilst in the employ of the Council. Mr. Shipp had been reminded by the Clerk that the Willow Crescent corner was included in his schedule of work. The blade on the machine had been damaged. This had now

- 5565 Rubbish Old School Lane. K.P.H. had seen both Mr. Morley (5522) and Mr. Nosworthy of Pearson Close. Mr. Morley now seemed satisfied and Mr. Nosworthy would clear up the remainder of the rubbish left behind by Moss.
- 5566 Stone Chippings. The complainant would either sweep up (5523) the chippings or see the landlord of the White Horse about the problem.

- 5576 <u>Gas Main</u>. The Clerk had received a letter from Eastern (5528) Gas which stated that 14 trees had been planted to the Council's satisfaction. Unfortunately the trees had been vandalised.
- 5577 Science Park. The Chairman had received a letter from (5529) Dr. Bradfield, Bursar of Trinity in which he looked forward to meeting the Council on 6 June. He would be happy to take members on a conducted tour of the Science Park.
