Present: Over 60 residents packed the Hall supported by Mr.D.Pearsen, Chairman of the Parish Council (in the Chair) & Councillors, L.M.Forbes (Vice-Chairman), H.W.H.Easy, P.Kiddle, R.T.Summerfield A.W.Wenham and the Cbrk of the Parish Council. County Councillor Dr.H.Hartley & District Councillor, K.P.Humphries. Apologies from Councillors, Mrs.M.E.Jones, Mrs.B.C.Waterson and M.J.D.Nurse.

2122.1 - MINUTES A brochure containing Minutes of the 1972 APM, audited & ACCOUNTS

Parish Council Accounts for 1972, previsional Parish

Accounts to March, 1973 & Parochial Charity Accounts for 1972, was distributed. Matters arising were taken and the Minutes then confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

2122.2 - GRAY, CONOLEY The Clerk reported conclusion of negotiations for LAND, COLES RD. (1946) purchase except for the legal 'paper-work'.

2122.3 - PUBLIC TOILETS The meeting discussed the effect of the present & CHANGING ROOMS (1999) sewage embarge which was preventing this 209 scheme from going ahead. Councillor Humphries that the embargo may be lifted for this project as a special case.

2122.4 - PROPOSED The Clerk explained in some detail the nature of the NORTHERN BY-PASS objection put forward at the Public Inquiry in July, (1950) 1972. The Council had succeeded in getting the DOE to agree to a ground-level read (instead of a 24-foot embankment) and an interchange with the A.10 to the west, but would give he date for the building of a Milton By-pass which they promised. They agreed traffic through Milton would increase emermously as a result of the Northern By-pass. We still awaited the Inspector's Report.

2122.5 - PROPOSED County Councillor Dr. Hartley told the meeting that the MILTON COUNTRY Countryside Commission had recommended the County Coun-PARK (1956) cil te set up a Country Park, south of the Fen Road and east of the A.10, and would pay 75% of the initial cost of Stage I (some 60 acres) totalling £56,896.

In discussion two main points emerged: that the postponement of about 30 acres to Stage II leaves a high proportion of water to land and the Park would suffer from lack of adequate car-parking; concerning traffic and access it was regretted that the Park would inevitably bring more traffic into the village and agreed that access via Old School Lane was not desirable.

2122.6 - PROPOSEDE The Parish Council had received a petition of 450 GYPSY CARAVAN SITE signatures against this in July last year and had made strong protest to the County Council on grounds of its detriment to the environment, traffic dangers on the A.10 and that there is a very old gypsy site in the parish already. St.John's College were refusing to sell and the County Council were looking elsewhere.

2122.7 - MILTON Mr.Forbes, Chairman of the Managers, was happy to repPAROCHIAL SCHOOL ort a very successful year & an excellent spirit of
co-operation between parents & staff; its fame outside
the County brought many English & Commonwealth visitors. He expressed his
deep gratitude to Mr. Whitton, Headmaster, for his work for our children.

2122.8 - VILLAGE Mr.D.Cooke said that new the Hall was so popular day-HALL COMMITTEE to-day running was now covered by income. All the varied activities continued but the Committee would welcome more recruits to ease the burden of running the Hall.

2122.9 - RABBITS A vigorous discussion arose over the Recreation Ground alleged by Mr.Capitain to be in a 'disgusting state' - overrun by rabbits & poor grass. Mr.Cooke said the grass was being treated on advice from the Farm School. The Clerk agreed to seek help

from the Public Health Dept. Redent Officer about the Rabbits.

2122.10 -PARISH These showed a balance of £522.63 after expenditure COUNCIL ASCOUNTS of £430.93 en Village Hall & Recreation Gd.;£116.90 1971/1972 repairs & maintenance of bs shelters & wayside seats and grass-cutting (verges); Admin, expenses:£311.16. Proposed by Mr.G.Russell, seconded Mr.R.T.Summerfield be accepted.

2122.11 - PARISH COUNCIL ACCOUNTS PROVISIONAL 1972/3

These showed a balance of £726.31 (Deposit &Current) after expenditure of £162.05 on Village Hall & Rec. Ground; £17.73, 'bus shelters & grass verges; Admin. expenses & insurance £129.90.

2122.12 - PAROCHIAL CHARITY ACCOUNTS TO DECEMBER 31st. 1972

After allotting £250 according to the Scheme, including £126.15 distributed in coal & greceries in the village, a debit balance of £1.74 was carried forward to 1973.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

2122.13 - DOGS Mr.L.Clarke (30, High St.) complained of the nuisance FOULING PATHS caused by owners allowing their dogs to foul the pavements. The Clerk said he understood from the County Council and Police that there were no bye-laws in rural areas against this but he would make further inquiries.

2122.14 - TRAFFIC The meeting shared general concern at the DOE's prop-THROUGH VILLAGE esal to increase the speed limit and Mr.L.Clarke mentioned the particular danger in the narrow High St. The decision was still awaited and the Parish Council had asked that this be at least deferred until the By-pass position was clarified.

2122.15 - STATE Several complaints were made of the danger to walkers

OF HALINGWAY and cyclists due to the shocking condition of the

path, and the Chairman said a letter from this meeting

would be sent to the Conservators. Although general

motor traffic along the towpath is prohibited those dwelling near the
