

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD

APOLOGY FOR ABSENCE.

An apology for absence was received from Mrs. D. Pearson.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

Mr. D. Pearson proposed and Mr. A. W. Wenham seconded that  
Mr. E. J. Walkling be re-elected Chairman for the year.

An amendment proposed by Mr. L. M. Forbes that Mr. D. Pearson  
be appointed Chairman did not receive a seconder. Thereupon,  
Mr. E. J. Walkling was elected Chairman, and he signed a Declaration  
of Acceptance of Office.

MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

Village Hall - Heating. Mr. Siggs submitted costs of electric  
storage heaters, eight of which would be required to adequately heat  
the hall. These would cost approximately £95, with running costs  
averaging 3s. Od. per hour. It was decided not to proceed with this  
method of heating owing to the high costs involved. As an alternative,  
it was unanimously resolved on the proposition of Mr. L. M. Forbes,  
seconded by Mr. D. Pearson, that Mr. Siggs purchase a second-hand  
Tortoise stove at a cost of £5.

Village Hall - Water Supply. A quotation from Messrs. Lack & Son,  
amounting to £24. 16s. 7d. for extending the water supply to a sink  
in the hall was accepted.

Bus Service - The Bus Company confirmed that the journey which  
commenced on 7th May departing from Waterbeach for Cambridge at  
8.0 a.m., was in fact an additional facility.

Prevention of Damage by Pests - The Clerk reported that  
Chesterton Rural District Council had promised that their Rat Catcher  
would give immediate attention to Bankers Ditch and to the Awarded  
Ditch in Butt Lane. Mr. Pearson reported that this work had already  
been done.

VILLAGE HALL - CLEARING OF GROUNDS.

Mr. Pearson was asked to cut the hedge and generally tidy up  
the grounds preparatory to sowing grass seed.

the window cleaner on his next visit to the village.


