### MILTON PAROCHIAL (CONTROLLED) SCHOOL.

The School Managers had authorised the Headmaster to proceed with arrangements for installing a swimming pool at the school. As the pool would be available to a large section of children in the village the Managers had approached the Council for a grant towards the provision of such an amenity. The cost was likely to amount to £500, towards which the Education Authority would make a 50% grant. After a full discussion, and on the proposition of Mr. L. M. Forbes, seconded by Mr. E. J. Walkling, it was agreed to make a grant of £100 forthwith.

A counter proposal by Mr. J. S. Doggett that a grant of £50 be made forthwith and a further grant of £50 during the next financial year was not supported.

#### SPEED OF TRAFFIC IN BUILT-UP AREA.

A fatal accident had recently occurred at the junction of Fen Road and the A.10 trunk road and despite efforts to have the speed limit sign moved to a point further from the built-up area, or alternatively the provision of an island site to deter motorists from entering the village at an excess speed, the Clerk was instructed to again approach the County Surveyor asking that further consideration be given to this latter expedient. It was felt that the provision of such an island would be the only deterrent to excessive speed. It was also agreed that copies of the letter be sent to the Chief Constable, the Accident Prvention Council, the Ministry of Transport and to the member of Parliament for the County of Cambridgeshire.

### MAINTENANCE OF GRASSED AREAS.

Following an enquiry from a Parish Council for the introduction of a scheme of maintenance of grassed areas on estates in villeges which do not form part of the public highway, the Rural District Council were carrying out a survey to ascertain the extent of these areas and to obtain the views of parish councils.

The Council were asked if they would wish to participate in such a scheme, and if so, would they be prepared to contribute towards the vost of the work on one of the following bases:-

(i) 50% of the cost (ii) 75% of the cost.

It was agreed that such a scheme would be very desirable and the Council would be prepared to contribute 50% of the cost involved.

The Clerk was instructed to reply to this effect and to submit a list of the grassed areas which would need attention.

# SCHOOL HOUSE AND OLD SCHOOL.

Mr. Forbes referred to correspondence he had had with the Bursar of King's College concerning the dilapidated state of the old school and school house. The College had referred the matter to the Rector, Rev. H. C. Franklin, who was seeking advice.

## CAMBRIDGE ROAD ENTRANCE TO RECREATION GROUND.

A letter was received from the Village Hall and Recreation Ground Management Committee asking that an approach be made to the Rural District Council for permission to close the Cambridge Road entrance to the Recreation Ground to prevent it being used as a path for cyclists and pedestrians to Coles Road.

It was agreed to recommend to the Rural District Council that the plot of land be used for other purposes, or alternatively that they dispose of it.

- (i) <u>Telephone Kiosk</u> The Clerk was instructed to ask that the whole of the bottom half of the kiosk door be blacked out in order to prevent glare from car headlights.
- 1122. (ii) <u>Pillar Boxes</u> It was agreed to ask the Postmaster to provide pillar boxes at Cherry Close and at Butt Lane corner.
  - (iii) Waste Land on Coles Road Estate The plot of waste land on Coles Road estate which the Council had declined to accept from the developers, Messrs. Gray, Conoley & Company, was fast becoming an eyesore. This land adjoined the recreation ground and the Council now felt that if they could gain control of it it could possibly be used as an adventure playground. It was agreed to re-open negotiations with Messrs. Gray, Conoley and Company and ask if they were still willing for the Parish Council to have control of it.
