MINUTES.

The Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 29th March, 1960, were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

PARISH COUNCIL ACCOUNTS.

The Clerk presented the Parish Council Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 1960. After inspection these were unanimously adopted on the proposition of Mr. S. A. Siggs, seconded by Mrs. D. Pearson.

MILTON PAROCHIAL CHARITIES ACCOUNTS.

The Clerk presented the accounts of Milton Parochial Charities for the year ended 31st December, 1960. A total of £75. 0s. 0d. was distributed as follows:-

The proportion due to the Village Fund was distributed in the form of coal; 36 agreed recipients each receiving 2 cwt.

On the proposition of Mr. A. W. Wenham, seconded by Mr. D. Pearson, the accounts were adopted.

MILTON SCHOOL MANAGER'S REPORT.

Mr. L. M. Forbes in reporting as the Council's representative to the School Managers spoke of the excellent choice made when appointing Miss Foulkes as Head Mistress. The number of pupils attending the school was at present 66, but this figure was likely to increase to 76 the following term. The school, unfortunately, was already too small to cope with the increasing number of pupils and additional accommodation was urgently required.

IMPINGTON VILLAGE COLLEGE.

Mrs. Pearson reported there were some 700 children attending the College. The project for providing a gymnasium had been shelved for a year or so, but the proposal to provide a swimming pool was being actively pursued through the efforts of the Parent Teachers' Association and the Students' Council. Meetings of the Parent Teachers' Association were not very well attended and Mrs. Pearson appealed for greater support from parents.

MILTON VILLAGE HALL.

Mr. Siggs reported that the Caretaker Committee had decided to call a meeting of all representatives on the Planning and Building Committee to decide the best course to adopt in regard to the accumulated fund amounting to £748. This meeting was scheduled to take place on 21st April, 1961, and Messrs. L. M. Forbes, C. L. Moule and L. F. Coulson were elected to attend as the Village Representatives.

OVER 60'S CLUB.

Mrs. Pearson reported there were 60 members and the usual annual outing had been provided free of any charge to members. A bazaar had been organised which resulted in a profit of £76, and it was hoped this would become an annual event. Thanks were expressed to the Council for the free use of the Village Hall for their gatherings.

The Chairman said how successful had been the New Year Party and paid tribute to the organisers.

APPOINTMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TO VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE.

On the proposition of Mr. D. Pearson, seconded by Mr. L. M. Forbes, it was unanimously agreed that the Youth Club be invited to nominate one of their members to serve as the Village representative on the Village Hall Management Committee.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
