I. COUNCIL

- 1. 37/93 Community Education. D.T.W. welcomed Andy Allen Patch Co-ordinator to the meeting. There was uncertainty over the budget for 1993/4 and likely to be a cut. 5/12 only of the budget (April to September) was due to be allocated. After a review of Community Education services by the Assistant Director of Education there was likely to be a restructure from September to March 1994. For Mr. Allen priority areas were:
 - To maintain the level of adult education;
 - To develop further youth work especially in Milton, Dry Drayton and Dakington.

Agreed to protest strongly to the Chief Executive County Council and Director of Education about the probable loss of community education services. A consultation document was circulated. Comments to be made to Assistant Director of Education by March 8th. D.T.W. thanked A.A. for attending.

2. 38/93 Minutes of the meeting of January 11th having been circulated were confirmed and signed.

3. Matters Arising

- 39/93 Land adjacent to slip road. It was noted that the land (381/92) had been tidied. The clerk had sent thanks to Mrs. Wilson and had asked S.C.D.C. to clean up rubbish on the "highways" side of the fence.
- 40/93 <u>Drive Carefully Signs.</u> Designs from engraving company (387/92) were to hand to be sent to Tesco for their comments.
- 41/93 <u>Mobile Library</u>. It was noted that the library van was (415/92) due to try alternate morning and afternoon stops.
- 42/93 Sports Pavilion. Noted that the contractor had agreed (435/92) to repair a "latent fault" in the shower area. Three quotations had been requested for the screening of the showers.
- BMX Track. Copy of letter from M.C.C. to youngsters concerned about loss of track received. Agreed that the clerk ask M.C.C. to suggest where a track could be sited as there appeared to be a need for one. The question of the removal of the seats from the Coles Road recreation ground was raised noted that the M.C.C. had decided to site two on the bowls green and two at The Sycamores.

 Agreed to purchase an extra 8' seat for the bowls green.
