MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL MAY HELD IN THE GRANARY, WILLOW FARM, ON MONDAY 1st (1967

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There were present: Mr.D.Pearson, Chairman, Mrs.B.Pearson Messrs J.S.Doggett, J.W.R.Lewis, E.J.Walkling, A.W.Wenham, together with the Clerk.

APOLOGY FOR ABSENCE - An apology for absence was received from Mr.L.M.Forbes.

1251 MINUTES (1239)

The circulated minutes of the meeting held on March 7th 1967 were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES.

Speed of traffic in Built-up Area (1240) - The Clerk reported he had still had no reply from the Divisional Engineer to whom the Minister of Transport, Mrs Barbara Castle, had passed his letter of 10th February for direct reply.

The Clerk read a letter from Dr. H.Hartley with which he had called on the Clerk enclosing reports of meetings of the Eastern Accident Federation Federation of Rospa which he thought would illustrate to the Council "the multiplicity of National Committees% through which road safety matters had to pass.

It was agreed that Dr. Hartley should be thanked for his interest in the matter.

On the suggestion of Mr.Wenham, and unanimously agreed the Clerk was instructed to thank the Police for their effactor entervision of the speed limits through Milton and ask them for statistics concerning infringements and accident rate.

Waste Land. Coles Road (1241) - The Clerk reported that he was awaiting clarification by Messrs Theodore Goddard & Co. of the density of housing suggested by Messrs Gray Connoly for their proposed housing at the end of Old School Lane.

Landbeach Road Cemetery (1242) - It was resolved that a lette ter of thanks be sent to Mr. David Bull of Rectory Farm for his co-operation in the cutting of the Cemetery hedgerow.

Maintenance of 'Bus Shelter lighting (1243) - The Clerk reported that he was awaiting the necessary Contract Forms from Eastern Electricity.

Village Hall Committee of ManagementM(1245 & 1246) - The Clerk reported that the Secretary had at last submitted as more comprehensive statement of Receipts and Payments for the year ending 31st. March 1967. This showed a balance in hand of £1,311 18.

The Secretary had also asked for the Council's nomination of representative on the Committee for the ensuing twelvemonths. It was resolved to leave this until after the forthcoming Parish Council Elections and the subsequent Annual Parish Council Meeting.

The Clerk read a reply from the County Planning Officer to the Parish Council explaining why only temporary Paanning

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Planning permission had been granted for the new Hall.

The reply emphasised the importance of maintenance on such temporary materials exposed to the elements and the responsibility of the Council in this respect. At the suggestion of Mr.J.S.Doggett and unanimously agreed, the concluding sentence of the Planning Officer's letter, Ref: C/66/878/Ph of 16th March, 1967, is minuted in full as follows:

"I would add, however, that at the end of 10 years, if the building has not deteriorated in appearance or structure, an extension of the planning permission will be automatic.

After detailed discussion it was proposed by Mr.J.S.Doggett and seconded by Mr.J.W.R.Lewis that a public notice of sale be inserted in the Press and the attention of Messrs King, Metter and Harrison be drawn this; the advice of the District Valuer also to be obtained as to a suitable reserve price for the guidance of the Council.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING.

Telephone Kiosk (1166) - The Clerk said he had again written to the Post Office re-opening this matter with them and received acknowledgement.

1258 <u>Notice Board</u> - The Clerk submitted a request from Mr.G.Russell as to the design and position of the notice board which he had offered to provide.

Mr.J.S.Doggett proposed and Mrs.I.Pearson seconded that it be sited on the corner of the green surrounding the Memorial.

Mr. Lewis put forward a design, which was agreed, consisting of a b board 4feet by 3 feet on black wooden supports with weather board top and standing about 6feet 6inches from the ground. The board to be protected by wire or glass front and padlock and key. The Clerk was instructed to inform Mr. Russell accordingly.

Tree Climbing by Children - It was resolved that the matter of alleged danger to children climbing certain trees between Fen Road and Old School Lane be not proceeded with.

Path sacross War Memorial Green - The Clerk was instructed to ask the County Surveyor if he would make this into a permanent metalled pathwa

1261 SIZE OF COUNCIL.

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The Clerk read a reply from the Clerk of the County Council to the Parish Councils request for information on invreasing the size of the Council. It appeared **That**phe increase in the population of the parish (would make this quite reasonable but co-option was not possible and H could only be effected at the time of the next elections.

1265 <u>DEVELOPMENT AT MILTON HALL</u>.

Mr. J.S.Doggett raised the question of pending development at Milton Hall by Esstern Electricity. Mr.J.W.R.Lewis raised the matter of an appeal against refusal of the Planning Dept. to allow a bungalow to be built in connection with the applicant's Riding School at Chesterton Fen Road. This appeal weg, in fact, being held the very next day (May 2nd) in Cambridge.

It was agreed that the Council should support the applicant in this desirable form of development and that Mr. Lewis and the Clerk draft a letter immediately after the present meeting for delivery at the enquiry at 10 a.m. the next day.
