I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

- Telephone Kiosk Milton Bypass. No further reply Clerk to chase (4757) before July meeting.
- Temporary Library. S.B.P. agreed to put in hand a request for Planning (4760) Permission and liaise with the Clerk.
- 4791 Milton Bypass Footbridge. Following information received from the (4759) Rev. Kilner, it was understood that negotiations over land acquisition are now complete. The Clerk would again write to the County Council for a progress report.
- 4792 Joint Meeting with Village Hall Management Committee. The date for the (4763) meeting was set at Tuesday 23rd June 1981 at 7.30 p.m. in the Village The Clerk would advise the Committee Secretary, Mrs. J. Evans, Hall. 16 High Street, accordingly - all officers and interested members could attend.
- 4793 Subsidization of Bus Passes. The Clerk reported that 3 applications (4764) had been received to date. There was, however, some confusion amongst pensioners in respect of the date of issue (1.5.81) from which the scheme became operational.
- Waterbeach & Landbeach District Plan Draft Proposals. The report had 4794 (4768) not yet been seen by all members - there were no comments to date.
- Parking Complaint Old School Lane. The University's Department of 4795 (4771) Estate Management had written to apologize and confirm that the two organisations concerned would be notified of the problem. The Clerk would forward a copy reply to Mr. Buttress of 34 Old School Lane for
- 4796 Mr. Crossman. The Clerk received a reply from Mr. Crossman offering to (4773) provide any further help in connection with the Milton Plan.
- Goding Way Street Sign. The S.C.D.C. confirmed that the matter is in (4774) hand for repairs to be carried out.
- The Chairman thanked P.K. for cutting the village green. 4798 Grass Cutting. (4776) R.T.S. suggested that grass cutting should be put forward as a topic for the joint meeting with the V.H.M.C. with a view to purchasing a selfpropelled mower and employing someone to carry out the cutting. H.E. was asked to obtain price information for a suitable mower. H.E. would also notify the Clerk of the name and address of the Benet Close resident who had been cutting the area at the end of the Close - the Clerk would then send a letter of thanks.

- 3. 4799 Accounts Summary. The summary sheet prepared for and circulated at the A.P.M. covering the Council's accounts for year ended 31st March 1981 was duly approved after deletion of the word "provisional".
- 4. 4800 Milton Area Draft Plan. K.P.H. had prepared a report on the Milton (4772) Plan Steering Panel Meeting held 21-5-81 which had been circulated and copies placed on the P.C. Notice Board. A brief was discussed in preparation for the meeting to be held on Thursday which R.D. and R.T.S. would attend on behalf of the P.C. P.K. proposed two main objections, firstly that the P.C. consider that the level of housing development is too high - it had already been suggested that 45 acres be moved to the Kings Hedges area. Secondly that the village has a problem with drainage now and unless steps are taken the system certainly cannot take the development. A Public Enquiry should be requested if these points were not satisfactorily resolved.
