I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 357/93 Community Education - Youth Work. R.J.F. welcomed A. Allen and C. Ratcliff of I.V.C. They reaffirmed their commitment to maintaining and developing the youth service. A.A. wished to introduce regular staff training, for youth workers. Issues such as drugs, alcohol would be discussed at youth group meetings.

He would like to see a detached worker at Milton as at Girton. The Girton project was funded by the community budget and a grant from Girton P.C.

He felt that the group who met in July (min 230/93) should continue to meet. R.D. pointed out that this group felt that the idea of a detached worker had more potential than the Bus Project. A.A. to contact Girton P.C. to produce an evaluation of the scheme with costing.

R.J.F. thanked Any Allen and Chris Ratcliff for attending.

Confirmed the clerk's action in ordering (335/93) delivery and erection of three bus shelters with seats for £4719 + VAT. The clerk to inform the resident of 1 Cambridge Road about the proposed shelter. 6. 375/93 Rowans Play Area. A quotation of £105.00 + VAT was (320/93)received and noted. A second quotation was awaited. R.T.S. proposed A.J.C. seconded and all agreed to accept the lower quotation.
