2807 MR HWH EASY Members were concerned to hear of his illness; AGREED: the Clerk send a letter on behalf of the Council and Mrs. Jones to take him flowers.

2808 REPLACEMENT NOTICE AGREED: size to be about 5ft.X 3ft. this to inc-BOARD (2783) \( \text{clude} \) an area at top, about 6inches wide for title.

2809 DUTCH ELM DIS- Clerk read replies to the circular letter sent out in EASE (2784) October: <u>From E.Elec</u>: Mr.Ransley was consulting the T&WOff. with a view to action on diseased trees and

replanting; it might be necessary to postpone any action until spring. From Mrs.Cashmore, 7 Knight's Way: sharing the Council's concern, but in view of expense of removal and uncertainty of cure are awaiting to see the effects of the winter. AGREED: write further to E.Elec. to find out what action being taken and if any appropriate tools available ask to berrow in event of removing diseased trees elecewhere in village.

- 2810 BY-PASSES Allotments (i) Clerk rptd. that a reps. of the Co.Land (R2/CR20/2785) Agent had asked for an interview with the Clerk concerning possible re-arrangement of CC holdings; this fixed for December 3. AGREED: in view of this re-distribution of parish tenants (agreed 2785) now be held over until after the talks; the Clerk instructed to make it a condition of any re-arrangement that they concede immediate replacement of allotment land in order that the reassurances recently given to displaced parish tenants that alternative land will be available, can be honoured i.e for cultivation next Spring. (see also ii, foll.)
- (ii) Notice recd. from D. Valuer to treat for compensation under the compulsory purchase procedure for land to be taken from the allotments by the DoE; AGREED: on prop.pk, sec: BCW, that an agent be employed and that Messrs Wild & Hewitson be approached for this matter alone.
- (iii) Following rpt. as in CR20, the official, firm date given by the DV (in ii, above) for the entry of DoE into the parish allotments is <u>February 29, 1976</u>. This appears to confirm the view that the Milton By-pass will go ahead next year in spite of contrary rumours recently.
- 2811 CHANGING PK rptd: work on interior proceeding; AGREED, that ROOMS(2786) that the sammof £1,200 be made available to the Changing Rooms a/c on 1 week's notice from the Secretary of the Working Party.
- 2812 STRUCTURE PLAN AGREED: that as the CC pamphlet still in circulation (R2/CR12/2787) amongst members, a special meeting be called later for thorough discussion on this Plan whose effects are intended to be far-reaching.
- 2813 ALLOTMENT RENT Indication from the Co.Land Agent's rep. (see 2810) (R2/CR15/2788) that this matter would be discussed with the Clerk on Wednesday, December 3.
- 2814 CAMBRIDGE ROAD AND COLES The Clerk said he had noted that some of ROAD DITCHES (2789) the rubbish being cleaned out of these ditches was being thrown back and he would tell the SCDC Engineer's Dept. of this.
- 2815 MVRS -BROKEN GLASS The Clerk explained the fresh information: i.e. (R2/CR13/2791) that employees knocked bottles on to the Grd. off the back of the cullett with a football. He awaited reply on the two matters CR13.
- 2816 VILLAGE HALL INSURANCES (i) Music & Dancing Licence The Clerk's . (R2/CR/19/2792) comments at CR19 were accepted but it was AGREED (on suggestion of PK) to submit the following for Mr. Martindale's advice: that the VHComm. be advised they should write to their named licencee advising him that any financial claim against infringement of licencing regulations would be indemnified by the Committee who, in turn would be indemnified by the Parish Council;
- (ii) VH Ins. Policy AGREED as in CR19 (ii) and no action to be taken.
- 2817 PARISH COUNCIL <u>Public Liability</u> As a result of discussion on on INSURANCES 2816, AGREED: this cover be increased to £250,000.
- 2818 109 'BUS SHELTER Awaiting further reply from City Surveyor on re-Z DRUMMER STREET iterated complaint, as in CR18. (R2/CR18/2795)
- 2819 TREE PLANTING Clerk rptd: Trees not yet delivered but holes pre(R2/CR/14/2777) pared by members (assisted by Mr.Douglas Johes &
  Mr. David Waterson, with refreshments suppield by
  MrsM.E.Jones) on 3 sites: Fen rd. east; Coles rd. verge and corners of
  Bene't Close. Hopeful that trees will arrive for pltg. w/e Dec.6/7.
- It was regretted that, the sites already being decided, there would be no opportunity this year of planting extra ones in Butt Lane which could be conveniently adopted by Schoolchildren.

2820 BANK RENTS Reply rcd. from Messrs Barr Ellison on behalf of (R2/CR16/2734) Mr. D. Pearson denying the Council's claim. Reference was made to this matter as of joint concern of the Parish Council and Charity Trustees, and that both these bodies had agreed that this denial of the Parish Council's claim should not be accepted. AGREED: Clerk write accordingly re-affirming the claim to parish land, and restate the demand for the back 6 years rent owing by Mr. Pearson. AGREED also, (as in agreement with Trustees) Kings College be asked about the survey agreed between them and Mr. Pearson, which was to be made of the boundaries between King's College and Charity land.

2821 SIZE OF This had not been discussed by Council before and, after COUNCIL a short discussion, BCW, prop: JGC, sec. & AGREED: that the (R1/CR9) size of the Council remain unchanged.

### CKERK'S REPORT FOR JANUARY 5, 1976 - R3

CR 23 (R2/CR15/2813) ALLOTMENT RENT REVISION Action taken: 1. Interview with the CoLand Agent's representative - In this matter (as well as BY-PASSES: Allotments -CR20/2810) the mtg. was hardly satisfactory; the rep. maintaining he was not bound to produce a figure until later, and suggested we would equally be in order to deal in the same way with our tenants; a figure would likely be produced by him about May/June\* (1976) - the increase to be effective from Michaelmas. 1976. He also maintained that we had broken our Agreement in the manner of sub-letting and they were considering claiming re-entry into some of the allotments (about 5 acres?); he would provide us with a copy of the original Agreement.
