I PLANNING COMMITTEE

2859 Minutes of Planning Comm: of Jan 5 were confirmed & signed.

MATTERS ARISING

2860 S/1668/74: GRCave; Appeal against refusal for site for 'travelling  
(2833) caravn people' in Chesterton Fen: heard on Jan. 20, 1976  
The Clerk had written, as instructed, to the Inspector re-affirming  
the Council's support for the application.

On Jan 29, he had also recd. a letter from Coun. Crossman which was  
dated Jan. 19, asking for the Parish Council's views on this app-  
lication.

AGREED: send Mr. Crossman a copy of the Council's representations  
made to the Inspector.

2861 S/1575/75F: Haird DAL; use of premises for builder's business.  
(2782) Granted, personal to DAL Haird, for temporary period to  
31 December, 1978.

II COUNCIL

2862 MVRS: BROKEN GLASS Reply from Env. Health Officer: MVRS deny that  
(2841) ON RECREATION GRD. employees kick footballs at bottles on top of  
cullett - but wd. be sacked if they did; some  
possibility that MVRS wd. erect a wall as suggested, but SCDC are  
responsible for fence. Env. H. Off. asks if PC wd. be willing to  
share cost of wall; reluctant to issue summons (under new Powers)  
while amount of glass is very small but wd. reconsider if the glass  
increased.

AGREED, clerk to write that PC consider MVRS responsible for keep-  
ing glass off neighbours property.

2863 VILLAGE HALL M & D Licence: Mr. Connor, Hon. Secretary of Mgt. Comm.  
(2842) INSURANCES had written to say that as it appeared difficult to  
resolve this problem he would, 'if re-elected at the  
next AGM, be prepared to continue as the Licencee' - if this accept-  
able to the Parish Council and Management Committee.

AGREED: this was acceptable to the Council and a letter of thanks  
for this decision be sent to Mr. Connor.

2864 TREE PLANTING The Clerk had ordered a further 8 thorn trees to  
(2843) (COUNTY SCHEME) match those already supplied, in species and size,  
to complete the planting in Fen road near the river.

2865 STATE OF PAVEMENT BETWEEN BENE'T GGE. & 81A, CAMBRIDGE ROAD  
(2844)

The Chmn. reported that he had contacted the Highways Dept. and  
some repairs had since been done; the Highways Dept. still intend-  
ed to make a lay-by here.

After considerable discussion on the merits of a lay-by versus  
the original complaint and Mr. Jenkins' (81A, Cambridge rd.) obj-  
ection to a lay-by, AGREED, unanimously, on prop. GEP, see. BKC,  
that a lay-by be supported - particularly in view of the pavement-  
parking nuisance in front of the Dr's. surgery.

2867 CHANGING ROOMS Mr. Waggett put forward a request from Mr. Kiddle in  
(2811) PROJECT the latter's absence - that the Clerk now write to

documents relating to contracts be forwarded.

AGREED after discussion.

2868 HEDGE IN HWHE asked if Mr. Russell, owner of 'Hollydene' could  
BUTT LANE be asked to clip his front hedge which overhung the  
pavement and was causing inconvenience to passers-by.  
AGREED.

2869 GRAVEL EXTRACTION The Clerk (also being Clerk to the Charity Trustees)  
FROM MILTON FEN and those members who act as Representative Trustees  
to the Charities, were aware of the possibility of  
owners of land in Milton Fen being approached for gravel for the  
Northern By-pass, and, in view of Parish Council policy being opp-  
osed to this now brought this to the attention of this meeting.

Members recalled the firm policy of this Council in opposing both  
general gravel extraction and the possibility of digging a hole  
for a rowing course; they confirmed their strong objection to the  
digging of gravel in any part of Milton Fen.

minor items to succeed i.e. a rough hardcore road and, on a tech-  
nical point, a building owned by Mr. Stokes personally (not by  
Stokes of Cambridge Ltd. on whom the enforcement was served;  
4 major items, however, were quashed, with 'overwhelming amenity  
raasons' as being prejudicial to the future development of the
