The Council hereby refuses permission for a Mobile Home and 5 Caravans

t PT OSP 7277, Chesterton Road, Milton (For Mr F Smith)

in accordance with your application dated 14th October 1997

# for the following reasons:-

- 1. The proposed use of the site for gypsy/travellers' caravans is contrary to Policy SP/12/1 of the Cambridgeshire Structure Plan 1995 in that development in the countryside will be restricted to that which is essential to the effective operation of local agriculture, horticulture, forestry, permitted mineral extraction, outdoor recreation or public utility services. It is also contrary to Policy SP12/2 of the same Plan and Policy C1 of the South Cambridgeshire Local Plan (1993) in that the site lies within an Area of Best Landscape where the Local Planning Authority will not normally grant permission for development which would adversely affect its character.
- 2. The proposed use of the site for gypsy/travellers' caravans is contrary to Policy SP18/3 of the Cambridgeshire Structure Plan 1995 and Policies GB3/1 and GB3/2 of the Cambridge Green Belt Local Plan (1992) in that the site lies within the Green Belt around the City of Cambridge. Within the Green Belt there is a presumption against development and permission will not normally be given with the exception of development for the purposes of agriculture, outdoor participatory sport and informal recreation, cemeteries, institutions standing in extensive grounds, or other uses appropriate to a rural area. In addition permission will not normally be given for development where it would adversely affect the rural and open nature of the area.
- 3. The principles behind the Green Belt policies referred to in Reason 2 above are fully supported in PPG2 "Green Belts". In addition the development and use of the land as proposed would be contrary to the five principles set out in Para. 1.5 and Annex E refers to Para. 3 of DOE Circular 1/94 which states that gypsy sites are not normally appropriate in Green Belts.
- 4. Policy SP4/6 of the Cambridgeshire Structure Plan 1995 requires adequate provision to be made for gypsies who reside in, or resort to the County. Fen Road, Chesterton is already well serviced for travellers' sites and vacancies exist on Council run sites throughout South Cambridgeshire District Council and the County and on permitted private sites. There is no justification to increase this number.

Lease: Meetings had been held with Council's and Cambridge Housing Society's solicitors to discuss the Lease. Areas that needed resolving involved adjoining properties. The District Valuer had valued the land at £140,000 which had been accepted by CHS. The Lease would become effective at the time that this money was paid to Council. An "Option to Break" clause within twelve months of the signing of the Lease was included in the Lease. CHS had agreed to pay 50% of



Council's fees. If the Option to Break clause was taken up then Council would return the £140,000 less the legal fees and the ground would be returned to its original state

Use of the road by members of the public would mainly be on foot or cycle. Although RLEW & RTS proposed that Council's contribution towards maintenance of the road should be 5% this was not acceptable to CHS. If a figure could not be agreed in the future then it would go to arbitration. JEC felt that Council should not pay anything towards maintenance.

IFM proposed JS seconded and all agreed the following resolution:

" Milton Parish Council authorises the chairman and clerk to sign the lease which will be subject to a premium of £140000 being paid."

Street Naming: PKO proposed RTS seconded and all agreed to put forward to SCDC the name "Barnabas Shipp Court" for the scheme. It was noted that Council had considered Barnabas Shipp in the early 1960's as a street name. Barnabas who lived to be over 100 years used to keep the bus shelter clean in Cambridge Road. His garden backed on to the recreation ground adjacent to the development.

Finance: RJF proposed JEC seconded and all agreed that Council invest the £140000 till the "option to break" clause has expired. MCC and MPC meanwhile would look at how best to spend the money.
