- 3893 The minutes of the meeting of 5th March had been circulated and were confirmed and signed.
- 2. There were no matters arising.
- Complaint Against Lemin. 3894 Following the meeting on 5th March the (3858) majority of the Council visited the site and were shown around the factory. The noise levels were studied both inside and outside the unit and a slight hum could be detected in the area close to Mr. Jenkins' fence, but this was not felt to be excessive. It was however reported that there was a smell in the vicinity of industrial road.

Mr. Jenkins had written to the Clerk expressing disappointment at what he felt was the Council's negative attitude and asked to what numbers of the units on the industrial estate does the certificate of established use apply. The Clerk was asked to write to the Planning Officer to check on the old consents and hours of working.

K.P.H. had written to the Environmental Services Officer and in a reply dated 21st March it was stated that several actions had been taken in an attempt to improve the situation.

11. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 3903 The minutes of the meeting of 5th March had been circulated and following a proposal by B.C.W. the address specified in minute 3880 was amended to High Street, not Cambridge Road, and the minutes were then confirmed and signed.

2. Matters Arising

- 3904 Milton By-pass/Butt Lane Crossing. G.P. felt that the gaps in the (3871) traffic allowed the children to cross the road without difficulty and there was little point in pursuing the matter. The Chairman suggested that the situation should be left in abeyance and the mood of the village should be tested at the Annual Parish Meeting on the following evening.
- 3905 Allotments Notice to Quit. The Chairman reported that the Clerk had (3872) great difficulty in successfully negotiating a meeting with Mr. Legge who had cancelled two meetings which had been arranged with the Council. The latest date is Wednesday 4th April at 6.30 p.m. at the Chairman's house to discuss the forthcoming Tribunal.
- 3906 Grit Bin on Slip Road. The Clerk had again written to the Divisional (3878) Surveyor and Councillor Crossman had also written to offer his support, but as yet no decision had been communicated.
- 3907 Footpath Along Old A10 North. It was reported that this footpath has (3887) been reinstated.
- 3908 Fencing Across Old A10. The Clerk had received from the E.R.C.U. a copy (3842) of a letter written by the Project Manager of Bovis reporting that persons unknown had cut through the rails of the new fence so that the Cambridge Northern By-pass could be crossed. The Clerk was instructed to acknowledge the letter and indicate the Council's support for remedial action.
- 3909 Litter in the Village. The Clerk had contacted the Group Scout Leader (3889) who felt that the litter clearing scheme would provide a very worthwhile project. As soon as the work programme permitted the project would be commenced.
- 3910 Tree Rubbish Rectory Grounds. M.E.J. reported that the situation is still not satisfactory and the matter should be reviewed at the next Council meeting.
- 3911 Date for May Parish Council Meeting. Since no official revised date (3891) for the election has been advised the meeting planned for 14th May was not amended.
- 3. 3912 Request for Purchase of Recreation Ground Equipment. Following the Council's offer of finance the M.V.H.M.C. had held an extraordinary meeting on 29th March and provided a revised request covering requirements. a) A second-hand reconditioned tractor £700 plus VAT, b) refurbishing of existing gang mowers revised estimate up to £300, c) large garage to store tractor, mowers, roller and football posts etc. £1,326 and concrete base £200.

Following a proposal by G.P., seconded by P.K. it was unanimously agreed that the finance for these items would be provided.

- 4. 3913 S.C.D.C. Circular Emergency Planning in Cambs. The Chairman (or Clerk) was invited to attend a meeting on 14th April arranged by the County Emergency Planning Officer to outline the training activities planned over the next two winters associated with the present policy for war emergency. The Chairman agreed to attend.
