- 4. 301/91 Manager of M.C.C. Salary Review. After much discussion it was agreed to defer review till the October meeting.
- 302/91 Sycamores Recreation Ground. A report of the Committee 5. was received. R.T.S. proposed - it was agreed to defer consideration of car park improvements until there had been a review of funds. A.J.C. proposed and it was agreed to ask J.J. Hall to quote for laying a slab path along the eastern side of the pavilion. "Dogs" Committee to discuss fencing of new children's play area (268/91). Agreed to plant hawthorn on bund near pavilion. Agreed to allow clubs to install telephone at their cost in pavilion. A request for financial help towards remedial work on the square was noted. J.F.C.F. to ask his Committee to clarify and define costs.
- 6. 303/91 <u>Recreation</u>.
- (267/91) Tennis Courts. Now complete awaiting connection of electricity. Some vandalism had already occurred.

  R.D. had asked a local farmer to rotovate and seed the mound and was negotiating a reduction from Anglia and



Midland who were contracted to do this work. (R.D. felt that the local farmer had better equipment for such work.) Work on the old tennis court was due to start immediately.

(267/91) Bowls Green. The Water Company had asked for modifications to the underground water system.

Agreed to leave this until a similar problem had been resolved on the cricket square (letter received 26/7/91).

A. Hobbs felt that Council had received value for money and saw no reason to withhold the retention fee.

Agreed to pay £1000 and keep back the remainder pending further investigation of the water problem.

R.T.S. proposed J.F.C.F. seconded and all agreed that Council allow a final payment of £600 towards spiking, dressing, levelling etc., of bowls green during Autumn 1991.

The Bowls Club to employ A. Hobbs as the contractor.

<u>Under 16's Building.</u> This was on schedule within the budget price and due to be handed over on September 16th.

<u>Play Equipment</u>. The City Council were still awaiting delivery of the replacement part for the playhouse (Coles Road).

Seat and bins were still to be erected at the new play area on The Sycamores recreation ground.

R.D. thanked the Play Committee for the splendid new play area.

## 2. Matters Arising

312/91 Appeal by Trinity Hall. It was noted that the above (370/89 appeal had been withdrawn. (see below min 315/91)

313/91 Appeal by St. John's. St. John's had appealed against (51/91) S.C.D.C.'s refusal to grant permission for decked car parking at The Innovation Centre.

314/91 Application by Mr. and Mrs. B.R.H. Wilson. It was noted (248/91) that the above application plot 1 adjacent 60 01d School Lane had been withdrawn.

## 3. Decisions Received

315/91 Trinity Hall o.a. floorspace, car parking, landscaping (410/90) and ancillary facilities at Kings Hedges Road approved.

Conditions of siting, design and external appearance of the buildings, means of vehicular and pedestrian access and landscaping schemes including retention of existing trees or natural hedgerows. No trees to be damaged, destroyed, felled etc without consent of S.C.D.C.

Details of treatment of site boundaries to be approved. The scheme to include 1.8m high concrete post and chain link fence for boundary with railway line.

Level crossing to be relocated prior to any building work. Access from Kings Hedges Road to be located at least 150 metres from relocated level crossing.

Suitable fencing to be erected along A45 boundary; a strip of land 25m wide along A45 to be safeguarded from development; no direct vehicular or pedestrian access to the A45 to be allowed.

Provision to be made for roadway to cross the site to the south-east boundary adjacent to Trinity College Science Park.

Existing access from Kings Hedges Road and existing



public road across site to be closed. No buildings to be occupied until junction improvements at Milton Rd. and Kings Hedges Road intersection are completed.

Details of surface water drainage to be approved; surface water from impermeable parking areas to be passed through petrol/oil interception facility. Foul sewage discharge scheme to be approved. Oil and chemical storage tanks to be enclosed within an impervious bunded area of at least 110% of the tank capacity.

Construction work to be limited to 0700 to 1900 Mondays to Fridays and 0700 to 1300 on Saturdays. No Saturday afternoon or Sunday working unless agreed in writing.
