

A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 2nd., 1971, at 7.45 P.M.

1892

MINUTES OF MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 7th., 1971.

These had been circulated. Mr.Summerfield thought that Minute 1891 did not make clear the reason for the collapse of Messrs Warm Pak's wall. It was agreed unanimously, therefore, that the words "recent collapse of part of the boundary wall" be amended to "recent destruction by a lorry of part of the boundary wall" Minute 1891 was accordingly altered to this effect and initialled by the Chairman who then signed the Minutes after confirmation by the Meeting.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES.

1893

Recreation Ground Fence (Gravel Pit Bdy) (1875) - The Clerk reported he understood the Pit owners had retracted their agreement allowing a gate to be incorporated, pending a fresh Planning Application by them to fill in the pit. They had, however, now withdrawn that application but the R.D.C. Engineer had, as yet, nothing further to report on negotiations.

1894

Winship Estate, Screen of Trees (1876) - The Clerk reported that grass had been planted (as agreed) alongside the entrance roadway to the Estate and he would continue to press for the planting of the promised trees.

1895

Cambridge Road Entrance to Recreation Ground (1878) - The Clerk understood the R.D.C. were considering erecting a gate and fence at the Cambridge road end of this entrance to protect their right of way and against misuse of the entrance and cul-de-sac by motor traffic.

1896

Village Seats (1879) - The Clerk reported completion of the work by Mr. Haid on the War Memorial seat and the Railway Crossing Seat; the former had been secured to the ground (on the opposite side of Coles road, as agreed) by metal pins embedded in concrete.

It was pointed out that the Crossing seat timbers should be treated and the Clerk agreed to instruct Mr. Haid.

1897

Northern By-Pass (1880) - The Clerk read the reply from the E.R.C.U. to his provisional objection to the line of the By-Pass which confirmed the Engineers' statements at the July public meeting.

The E.R.C.U. now asked for details of any proposed amendments and the Meeting approved submission of a line previously proposed by Mr.Kiddle and discussed by Council.

1898

Public Toilets and allied facilities (1881) - The Clerk reported on correspondence with the R.D.C. in which he had made the necessary enquiries asked for in Minute 1881. This Public Health Committee were willing to consider a joint scheme proposed by the Parish Council for showers, changing rooms etc. and public toilets. They proposed discussions with the R.D.C. Engineer as to siting and design.

~~In his absence, Mr.Kiddle had sent the suggestion that Mr.Poulter be approached for technical advice before consulting the Engineer.~~

(1898) The Council agreed that he be approached.

1899 Village Hall direction sign (1882)- The Clerk reported that this sign had now been erected at the corner of Coles road.

MATTERS ARISING FROM EARLIER MINUTES.

1900 Waste Land, Coles road (1816)- The Clerk read a reply from Messrs Cooper Bros. indicating they were pressing for Planning Permission for residential development of the further piece of land which this Council had suggested for recreational use.

On the proposal of Mr. Summerfield, seconded by Mr. Easy the Clerk was instructed to proceed with the legal conveyancing of the land already promised to the Council under the terms agreed.

1901 COUNTRYSIDE PLANNING CIRCULAR

The Clerk submitted documents from the Planning Office which gave details of future conservation policies. The Dept. asked for details of any areas the Council would like to submit for conservation.

The following Committee, consisting of Mrs. Waterson, Messrs Nurse and Summerfield and the Clerk, was approved to consider the village in detail and furnish the detail required. Copies of their submission to be circulated to all members of the Council before despatch.

1902 MILTON PITS.

Arising out of a request by the Planning Dept. to the Clerk for the names of owners of flooded pits in the parish, it appeared they had in view the ultimate conservation of the whole of this 'lagoon area'.

1903 PLANNING & APPLICATION (since withdrawn)

0/71/646 - re-instatement of gravel pit by filling-in, excluding all retting materials.

Before this had been withdrawn the Clerk had replied, after circulating members, that although it could be considered an amenity it was dangerous and if filled in they did not want to see factories built on the land.

1904 MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT, 1970

Copies of this Report had been received and were available at the meeting.
